UPCOMING PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

The Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held in person in the classrooms on Monday, Nov. 21st, and Tuesday, Nov. 22nd. School will be dismissed at 12 Noon both days. **Junior high students (6th, 7th, & 8th Grades) are asked to**

join the parents for the conferences.

Parent/Teacher Conferences sign-ups will again be done through the SignUp Genius app. **Links for the SignUp Genius app were sent out this past Friday through Gradelink; and, the links opened up yesterday, Oct. 24th.** Signups will done online through Thursday, Nov. 10th.

There will be daycare available on both days until 6:00 pm. We would love to have both parents present and we ask that you are on time for your conferences.

- Once in the app, choose an available time, click on the sign up tab, and enter your information to schedule your appointment. **PLEASE NOTE: In the "Comments" section, PLEASE be sure to enter your child's name.**



COVID-19 REMINDER

Recently, there has been an increase in sick children. Most have been coughs and colds, however, we have had a couple of positive COVID-19 cases recently. If your child becomes ill, please test for COVID-19. A home test is sufficient.

Even if your child is negative for COVID-19, please keep your children at home until symptoms are better and children have been fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medicine. Remember, we want to lessen the spread of regular germs too.

If your child does test positive for COVID-19, we ask that you please notify the school office at principal@stlouisedm.org.

If a positive child or adult has been on campus in the past 48 hours, the school will notify the community of a positive case via email. If your child is identified as a "close contact" you will receive a separate email. Close contacts can remain in school but will need to wear a mask for a period of 5 days while on campus (the school can provide masks). Symptoms should be monitored, and close contacts should test after day 5 of exposure.

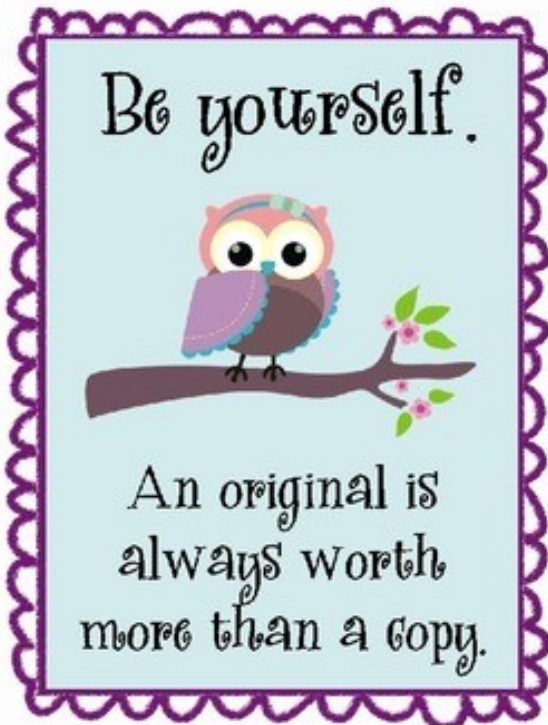

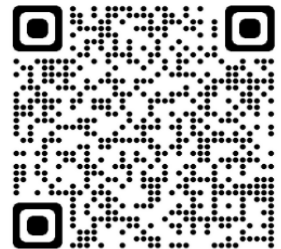

PASTOR'S CORNER

Blessed Carlo Acutis



In just a little over a week we will be celebrating All Saints Day. This is the day we recognize all the Saints in heaven, some not canonized by the Church. Only God knows all the Saints, so we celebrate all of them. This year, you might want to celebrate our youngest Beatified in this century.

Carlo Acutis, an Italian youth, died on October 12, 2006, at the age of 13. In his very short life, he demonstrated a great love for Jesus and Eucharist. He was a fan of St. Francis and asked that he be buried in Assisi like his hero. In 2020, Pope Francis declared him Blessed. Only four people have been Canonized or Beatified in the 21st Century who were also born in the 20th Century.

In many ways, he is a Saint for our times. Carlo was a self-taught computer programmer and gamer who loved soccer and the Eucharist. As a teenager, Carlo was diagnosed with leukemia. He offered his sufferings for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Church, saying "I offer all the suffering I will have to suffer for the Lord, for the Pope, and the Church."

From a young age, Carlo seemed to have a special love for God, even though his parents weren't especially devout. His mom said that before Carlo, she went to Mass only for her First Communion, her confirmation, and her wedding. But as a young child, Carlo loved to pray the rosary. After he made his First Communion, he went to Mass as often as he could. He went to confession weekly. He asked his parents to take him on pilgrimages — to the places of the saints, and to the sites of Eucharistic miracles.

His witness of faith led to a deep conversion in his mom, because, according to the priest promoting his cause for sainthood, he "managed to drag his relatives, his parents to Mass every day. It was not the other way around; it was not his parents bringing the little boy to Mass,, but he managed to get himself to Mass and to convince others to receive Communion daily."

He was known for defending kids at school who got picked on, especially disabled kids. When a friend's parents were getting a divorce, Carlo made a special effort to include his friend in the Acutis family life.

His devotion to Eucharist was fierce. He told people that "the more often we receive the Eucharist, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of heaven." He was buried in jeans and a pair of Nikes, the casual clothes he preferred in life.


In our Religious Education classes, we should teach our children about Carlo Acutis. Imagine that in our Confirmation classes students can learn about a Beatified person, close to them in both age and favorite activities. He certainly can be a role model for our teenage children.

DID YOU KNOW?

Have a safe and happy Halloween

With Halloween coming up, here are some safety tips for parents taking little ones trick or treating. Parents should check costumes for safety — be sure that they fit well and will not cause children to trip. Consider adding reflective tape to costumes, shoes, or trick or treat bags to make your children easier to see in the dark. Avoid sharp, long, or otherwise dangerous costume accessories like swords and canes. Also, check candy before children consume it.
