

PASTOR'S CORNER



All Saints Day - Holy Day of Obligation

We see signs of Fall all around us. The weather is cooler. Trees are losing leaves. Markets are full of pumpkins and decorative squash. Children are all excited about their costumes for Halloween. Skeletons and skulls abound as people get ready for Dia de Los Muertos. And we Catholics get ready to celebrate the feast days of All Saints and All Souls.

All Saints, celebrated on November 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation. That means, we are expected to go to Mass on that day.

Parishes offer several services to accommodate parishioners' work schedules. The Feast came about in recognition of the many martyrs of the early church and our need to recognize their sacrifice. However, there are not enough days in the calendar year to honor them all, so a day was set aside to honor all Saints. Historically there were pagan celebrations that dovetail with All Saints day, and as Christianity grew, many of these pagan holidays that already existed before Christianity were assimilated into the Christian holy days. Halloween is the one we most recognize as well as the Mexican Dia de Los Muertos. These other holidays are mostly recognized as fun or as honoring the dead.

All Souls Day follows All Saints Day on November 2nd. This is the day we remember all of the dead, in particular our own deceased relatives and friends. The Mexican tradition of building an altar in your home where you can exhibit pictures or mementos of your deceased family members can be a nice tradition you start in your own home. Stores are full of decorating items for your altar, and you can get the whole family engaged in creating this memorial. Since The Day of the Dead is celebrated November 1st and 2nd, the same as All Saints and All Souls Day, it gives you a chance to joyfully celebrate those whose presence you miss. Create a prayer service honoring your family and thank the Saints for their gift to all of us through the lives they lived that we try to imitate.

As Catholics, the point of a Holy Day of Obligation is to respect scripture and tradition. The very first holy day of obligation was laid out in Genesis. On the seventh day, the Lord rested. This became part of the Laws of Moses (the ten commandments) and is mentioned in Revelation as "the Lord's Day." At the last supper, Jesus even gave us what we are to do, "in memory of him." Our tradition is to offer mass on that day of rest and appreciate the gift of the Eucharist as part of the celebration.

Over time, the Church chose a few other special holy days to make days of obligation, requiring us to attend Mass. All Saints Day is one of those. The full list in the United States is as follows:

- January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God;
- Seventh Sunday of Easter, the solemnity of the Ascension;
- August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary;
- November 1, the solemnity of All Saints;

- December 8, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception;
- December 25, the solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

This Wednesday, I hope to see each of you on this special feast day. We can remember together all the Saints who have made our Catholic tradition rich and appreciate the sacrifices made to bring God closer to us.





ANNUAL THANKSGIVING DINNER

DID YOU KNOW?

What are the rules about minors serving as volunteers?

It is the job of adults — not minors — to protect children from harm and abuse. However, many minors are also volunteers at school and at church, which sometimes makes it difficult to know what roles minors should play. Within programs or ministries, there should always be an adult in an official supervisory role. Minors should be helping, but never directly in charge of younger children. Meeting this standard can be challenging but it is important in keeping all children, including minor volunteers, safe.
