



PASTOR'S CORNER



Stewardship of Creation

Farmers know you have to take care of the land if you want to grow healthy crops. The land is first prepared by tilling the soil. The land is fertilized if necessary. Seeds are planted. Trees may be planted as wind barriers to keep soil from blowing away. Farmers pray for rain when it is needed and pray that rain stay away when it would hurt the crop or harvest. Crops are rotated. Sometimes, fields are left fallow to recover from plantings. Any farmer knows that caring for his fields is primary to ensure a good harvest.

That is the attitude we need when we think of the ecology of the entire planet. In Genesis when God says, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. And let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth" we have traditionally thought of this as man has the right to subdue and rule. Some scholars think this is a simplistic interpretation.

Rather than giving human beings rights over nature, these verses give us the responsibility to care for nature in a way that is consistent with God's will. God gave us the Garden of Eden on this planet we share with all creatures and all of nature. It only makes sense that we need to protect it to maximize our use and the use of it for all of God's creatures. We should think of our relationship with the land more as stewardship rather than dominion. In Leviticus we read, "Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them, "When you come into the land which I give you, then the land shall keep a sabbath to the LORD. Six years you shall sow your field, and six years you shall prune your vineyard, and gather in its fruit; but in the seventh year there shall be a sabbath of solemn rest for the land... You shall neither sow your field nor prune your vineyard. What grows of its own accord...you shall not reap...for it is a year of rest for the land."



Today, the planet is under assault. Climate change has spurred floods and drought. Soon, we will not be able to sustain ourselves. Famine is already rampant in some parts of the world. Here, in the California southland, we are seeing historic drought and fires. We have not protected the earth; we have put it in danger. As Catholic Christians, we need to support all initiatives proposed to halt shortsighted use of the resources of the planet. We need to stop immediately the logging of the remaining rainforests, the makers of oxygen for us to breathe. We need to stop polluting and clean up pollution in the ocean and on land. We need to develop strategies of living that do not harm the environment. We need to rethink how, and how much water we need or use.

Pope Francis has been quite vocal on this subject. He reminds us that God gave the earth to all of us to care for and cultivate. God invited us to dominate the earth in His name, cultivating and tending it like a garden, "everyone's garden". This garden must be protected and preserved, continued the Pope. This cannot be interpreted in a way that allows us "to do whatever we want with the earth." The Pope stressed that it has been given to us by God and to the whole human race. Therefore, "it is our duty to make sure that its fruit reaches everyone, not just a few people."

Let each of us take up this call to be good stewards of the earth. Our children will thank us.

Veteran's Day offers the opportunity for our nation to both remember and express gratitude to those in the Armed Forces for their services and sacrifices made on behalf of our country.


St. Louise de Marillac will have a Mass honoring those who serve us on Thursday, November 11th at 8:30 AM.

DID YOU KNOW?

Use concrete visual rules to help children stay safe

Parents in a crowded place, like a playground or store, will often tell their children, "Stay where I can see you." While the parent understands that this means, "Stay close," a child does not necessarily understand the limit — when can a parent see or not see them? A clearer direction would be to tell your child, "Stay where you can see me." This gives them the boundary — they must be able to see you no matter where they go. Now, your child can check in frequently, all while staying in eyesight.
