



PASTOR'S CORNER



A Catholic School Education

As we head into the holiday season, gratitude should be on our minds. Thanksgiving is the ultimate gratitude holiday, and many people use it as an opportunity to think about and share what it is that each is grateful for at Thanksgiving dinner. I'd like to give all of you something to add to your gratitude list. A Catholic School Education.

We are lucky here at St. Louise de Marillac Church to be able to sponsor a Catholic School. Our former San Gabriel Bishop Dave O'Connell had made that a priority for all Catholic Parishes in the East San Gabriel region. Not all Parishes have been able to achieve that, yet. But we are hopeful.

There are so many reasons why parents want to give their children a Catholic education. Often mentioned are:

Uniforms: Uniforms are a timesaver, and they make it clear that it's time to focus on learning not fashion.

A Moral Compass: Our children need to have a sense of right and wrong. We don't want them to bully or be bullied. We want them to love and love deeply. We want them to understand sacrifice—and making difficult choices because they're right.

Service: We want our children to serve. Maybe they'll collect nickels and dimes for people locally and overseas who have less. Whatever they do, I hope they'll know that we serve not because of some vague notion of giving back and gratitude to some nameless entity, but because we follow Jesus who showed us how to give and serve.

Faith Sharing: They'll be able to talk about their faith with their friends. To grow in your faith, it's especially important that you have friends who share that journey with you.

Values: A Catholic education teaches students core values to help them mature into Christ-like people. Students learn self-discipline, how to accept responsibility for their actions, and to make good decisions based on the tenets of their faith. They also learn about commitment, respect for others, and service.

Academic Excellence. The children who attend Catholic schools tend to outperform their public-school counterparts. This is in no small part to all of the reasons listed above. When your values are solid, it is easier to focus on learning.

Here at St. Louise, we have provided a good education so our students can achieve excellence in body mind and spirit. Students receive challenging classes in all subjects to prepare them for high school and beyond. We have a sports program so our children can grow both physically and in learning about teamwork and cooperation. Physical education is an important part of our educational program.

These are many reasons to be grateful for a Catholic school education.

A Catholic school education is a sacrifice for many of our parents, financially. If your child cannot attend the school because

of an inability to pay, see if you might qualify for financial aid .


Agape Feast
