



The First Sunday of Advent

The Church has two seasons that are a time of reflection on the mysteries of our faith; Advent and Lent. The first Advent challenges us to ponder the incarnation of Christ: fully human while fully divine, becoming human as a vulnerable infant and born of a virgin.

Advent is a season of anticipation, of holy waiting. In remembering Christ's first coming, we acknowledge our anticipation of Christ's second coming. Advent should be a season of surprises too, of God showing up when and where we least expect him: in a womb, in a barn, in a homeless shelter, in that family member with whom you disagree, in every corner of this world from Kiev to Palestine, to your living room. It a season to slow down and pay attention, to look for God in God's disguises, in uncomfortable places, in unexpected times.

The first week of Advent is dedicated to hope. Our hope of course is the time when the Kingdom of God becomes a reality for all men and women. When you look around today, the kingdom feels very far away as we see war, natural disasters, the massive numbers of refugees worldwide, famine and poverty. We know this is not the world God envisioned for us. In fact, we were gifted with a planet rich in resources that needed to be carefully tended so everyone could thrive. It is important we do not give up hope. We believe Christ came into this world during a very dark period of history for the Jews. The homeland was occupied by the Romans. Life was not easy. Christ was and is the hope.

As we light the first advent candle, think upon the great gift that Jesus is. If we live by the Gospels, by the Beatitudes, we can recover. Beginning with war, we as Christians can fight for diplomacy rather than weapons. Looking at Ukraine and Israel, it seems almost impossible. But, through negotiations, some hostages have been released, some aid has come into Gaza, relieving terrible suffering. As Christians, we do not believe in retribution, we believe in forgiveness. Please don't think I am naïve. This will be a massive and difficult task.

Natural disasters, unprecedented throughout human history, occur around the globe. Climate has changed and as Christians, we need to be part of the solution in protecting all humanity from its ravaging effect. We need to insist the worldwide community of scientists, engineers and others gather to come up with solutions to mitigate or reverse this trend. I can't believe that this is not possible. In just my lifetime, I have seen unimaginable advances in science and technology.


