### "Immaculate Conception" School Mass


(This is a Holy Day of Obligation)



### **Christmas Concert Guidelines**

- 1. The show will go on if weather permits. If there is rain, we will share the link with families to view at home.

- 4. There are two options for viewing:

### SPIRITUALITY AND ENRICHMENT



### Advent

Finally, Advent is here! Advent is the season of hope. The first candle lit on the Advent wreath is lit for the virtue of Hope. We hope by the end of this Advent, we will have seen the worst of the Pandemic. After almost two years of living with the scourge of Covid-19, hope is what we must cling to.

Why should we be hopeful? In our Gospel of last week, Jesus, himself tells us that "...they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." (Lk 21:27-28)

In the Old Testament reading of last week, we hear the prophesy, "The days are coming, says the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise..." (Jer 33:14) When God fulfills the promise made in the First Covenant to the people of Israel, it will be made in the Second Covenant through the body of Jesus Christ. We need to keep that hope alive.

Advent is also the time for waiting and anticipating. I love watching children during this time. They are so excited about the coming of Christmas. They are thinking about toys, of course, but we should take a page from their book and get excited about the coming of Christ! "Advent," says Pope Francis, "is a journey toward the horizon of hope." The hope of Advent, the pope says, "does not disappoint because it is founded on the Word of God. A hope that does not disappoint, simply because the Lord never disappoints! He is faithful!"

The hope of Advent is not hope that Jesus will come back into the world at Christmas. Jesus already came into the world, two thousand years ago—Godmade-man, Word made flesh, in Bethlehem. This is a historical fact. Our hope is rooted in the present, and our future.

Hope is the knowledge that our lives have meaning—that each day that we live matters, and that we matter, because we are beloved by God and because he has a plan for our lives. Hope gives us freedom to live for what really matters. "The one who has hope lives differently," Pope Benedict wrote. "The one who hopes has been granted the gift of a new life."

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.

Matthew 3:3

Jesus promised his apostles that his father's house "has many dwelling places." We, his followers, are going to be in one of those rooms. When Jesus left us, he promised we would be reunited. He said "In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be." (JN 14:2-3)

So, let's get excited about the birth of Christ, once again. Let's get excited about our futures. Let us be filled with hope and see where that takes us. And let us do that together, here at St. Louise de Marillac Church in Covina, California.

peasant, Juan Diego, in 1531. The feast day is an important holi-


