

### **Christmas Concert Guidelines**

- The show will go on if weather permits. If there is rain, we will share the link with families
  to view at home.
- 2. Families may begin arriving at 6:00 p.m. The show starts at 6:30 p.m.
- 3. A special visitor from the North Pole will be available for a visit and picture between 6:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.
- 4. There are two options for viewing:
- a. There will be a section for those that wish to watch the show from lawn chairs directly in front of the screen. Bring blankets and wear warm clothing!
- b. There will be approximately 65 spaces available for those who would like to view from their car. Larger vehicles will be directed to park in the back row.
- 5. If you are watching from your chair, we ask that you please park on the street
- 6. If you are watching from your car, please only one vehicle per family.
- 7. Staff will be directING traffic that evening. Please listen to the direction of staff members.
- 8. If you are parking on the street, please enter the campus through the Bonnie Cove exit or the driveway between the church and parish offices.
- 9. Light refreshments will be available that evening.
- 10. We ask all families to stay for the duration of the show, which will be approximately 1 hour.
- 11. Students should sit with their families throughout the event. There will be no student supervision available that evening since students will be in the care of their families.
- 12. At the end of the evening, PLEASE, exit the lot carefully and watch for pedestrians.



#### **ONSITE COVID TESTING**

Testing is held in the parish hall every Friday at 8:00 am. This weekly testing is a free program through Heluna and Primary Health open to all on campus (vaccinated or unvaccinated), which includes staff, students, and any parents who volunteer on our campus. This program also satisfies the testing requirements for those who are in our athletic programs. If you wish to participate in the program, you need to preregister for testing by copying & pasting this link:

You only need to register once and each time you test, it will take no longer than 15 minutes. Students signed up for the program will be taken over to the Hall during the morning by a staff member to get tested. If you are a parent volunteer and want to get tested, you just need to go directly to the hall at 8 am. Results are generated and provided to both those that have been tested and the school. Please note this program is free for all participants. Thank you for helping us stay safe and prevent outbreaks!



### SPIRITUALITY AND ENRICHMENT



#### **Gaudete Sunday and Our Lady of Guadalupe**

Today is a day for rejoicing! The Church has wisely given us this day to take a minor break from the somberness of the Advent season of penance and reconciliation. Hopefully, up to this Sunday, we have faithfully delved deeper into our faith and connecting or reconnecting with God. One way we do this is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The Catechism notes that, "after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year." Advent and Lent

are traditional liturgical seasons of penance when the Sacrament of Reconciliation is encouraged. We and neighboring Churches have been trying to make this sacrament more available to you and your family.

On the third Sunday, additional signs of gladness are permitted. The priest wears rose colored vestments, the altar is dressed with flowers, the music is more upbeat. All three readings today express joy and the anticipation in the coming of the Lord.

In our first reading of Zephaniah, the prophet, we are told, "The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior; he will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, he will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals."

In Philippians we hear, "Brothers and sisters: Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near."

In Luke's Gospel, the words of St. John Baptist exhort, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

At the same time, I think we should take advantage of the fact that the Feast of our Lady of Guadalupe falls on the same day as the third Sunday of Advent. The Virgin is the patron Saint of all the Americas. She is special to us. In the Hispanic tradition, this is a major feast day and that is apparent in Southern California.

Mary's coming to Juan Diego was a powerful symbol to the people of Mexico. The fact that she came to an indigenous man who converted to Catholicism and

the apparition of her was as a dark-skinned woman indicates that she is here for the people, not the powerful. When she asked Juan Diego to go to the bishop and tell him that the Virgin Mary, Mother of God, sent him to ask for a church to be built atop Tepeyac hill, she was asking him to speak truth to power. This is not an easy task for anyone.



#### Try these tips to get your children talking about their days

Ever been met with silence when you ask, "How was your day?" Your communication efforts with your children, especially school-age children, may need some tweaking. Try asking concrete questions, like "Who did you sit next to at lunch?" or, "What was the most interesting thing you learned today?" If your child is struggling with sharing his or her emotions, it might be helpful to ask about other emotions you see around you.

Find opportunities to get children talking about how they feel by focusing on other people: "Why do you think that girl and her dad are hugging? What made that boy on the playground mad earlier?" You may be surprised at the results!

#### SIMBANG GABI

St. Louise is once again joining with local parishes in a Novena of Masses in



preparation for the birth of our Savior.

St. Louise's Simbang Gabi celebration will be held at the **4:30 PM** Mass on Saturday, December 18th.

During this Christmas season, Filipinos continue to celebrate this annual Novena Mass, "Simbang Gabi," a tradition they brought with them from the Philippines. Simbang Gabi was adapted from the Catholic Misa de Gallo, which literally means "Mass of the Rooster," to indicate it is held when the rooster crows.

Simbang Gabi traces its roots to Mexico when, in 1587, Fray Diego de Soria, petitioned the Pope for permission to hold Christmastide Masses outdoors because the church could not accommodate the multitude that attended the dawn services. The tradition started in the Philippines in the 16th century. It gave the farmers a chance to hear Mass before setting out for the fields. Rural Filipinos were used to starting the day two hours before sunrise. Church bells rang to call the faithful to Simbang Gabi. In some provinces, brass bands played traditional Christmas music and parish priests would go as far as knocking on the doors of every home.

During this season, Filipinos create beautiful decorations called "parol", paper lanterns to commemorate the Star of Bethlehem. These lanterns were used by the farmers to guide them in the dark to the Holy Mass. Choirs sang Tagalog songs such as Pasko na Naman" (It's Christmas Again).
