BE ON TIME! DON'T BE TARDY!



Dear Parents,

On December 31st and January 1st, the Public Health Department issued some updates to the Reopening Protocols for K-12: Appendix T1 and the COVID-19 Exposure Management Plan Guidance in TK-12 Schools: Appendix T2. The documents will be updated and posted on our school website by the end of this week. Two additional documents will be also be posted that offer detailed instructions should someone tests positive for COVID-19 (<u>Public Health Emergency Isolation Order</u>) and if you are considered a close contact (<u>Public Health Emergency Quarantine Order</u>).

Below you will find a synopsis of the updates:

Reopening Protocols for K-12: Appendix T1 (updated on 1/1/2022)

Strong *recommendation* for all eligible staff and students to receive a booster dose of the COVID-19 in addition to their primary vaccine series

COVID-19 testing *required* for all close contacts who are permitted to remain in school immediately after exposure, regardless of vaccination or booster status

Masking is now *required* for all outdoor activities where physical distancing is not feasible, except when eating and drinking. Students will be *required* to wear their masks when lining up in the morning and during our morning assembly since physical distancing is not possible.

Staff will be *required* to wear upgraded masks (surgical or higher-level PPE). Masks will be provided by the employer.

Students are strongly *recommended* to wear masks that are well-fitting, **non-cloth** masks of multiple layers of non-woven materials with a nose wire. Although this is not a requirement, please evaluate the masks that your children are wearing to make sure that they are well-fitting. In addition, it is important for students to bring at least two extra clean masks with them daily.

Exposure Management Plan (updated on 12/31/2022)

1)Quarantine, testing and masking guidance for persons exposed to COVID-19 in TK-12 aligns with the CDC and California Department of Public Health isolation and quarantine guidance for the general public

2)Those who present symptoms and are COVID-19 positive:

3)Self -isolate for 5 days since your symptoms appear and symptoms improved and are fever free without using fever reducing medication and you have a negative COVID-19 viral test collected after Day 5

4) Those who are asymptomatic but COVID-19 positive:

a)You may end your self-isolation if at least 5 days have passed and you remain free of symptoms and you have a negative COVID-19 test

If you choose not to test isolation can end after Day 10.

Contact anyone who may be a close contact

Those who are considered close contacts:

a)A) Self-quarantine can last anywhere between 5-10 days depending on your vaccination status

b)Close contact who are required to quarantine are: persons who are not fully vaccinated or people who are fully vaccinated and booster eligible but have not yet received their booster dose.

c)May end quarantine after 10 full days have passed or after 5 full days have passed from their last known contact if they have a negative viral test.

d)Close contacts should self-quarantine unless exempt. Exempt persons include persons who are boosted and or fully vaccinated but not yet booster eligible.

e)In order to remain at school, exempt close contacts are **required** to test immediately and after day 5 of exposure and monitor symptoms for 10 days. If tests are negative they may attend school.



REQUIRED VACCINATION/NEGATIVE TEST

RESULTS FOR ALL ON-CAMPUS VOLUNTEERS...

If you are a school volunteer and are assisting us with any job on campus (lunch duty, health room, coaches etc.) you are REQUIRED to provide proof of vaccination. If you have been fully vaccinated, please provide a copy of your vaccination card ASAP if you have not yet done so. If you are not vaccinated and would like to continue to be an on-campus volunteer, we ask that you show proof of a negative COVID-19 test each week to continue to volunteer on campus. You can sign up for our onsite COVID testing each Friday.

ONSITE COVID TESTING

Testing is held in the Music/Youth Room every Friday at 8:00 am. This weekly testing is a free program through Heluna and Primary Health open to all on campus (vaccinated or unvaccinated), which includes staff, students, and any parents who volunteer on our campus. This program also satisfies the testing requirements for those who are in our athletic programs. If you wish to participate in the program, you need to pre-register for testing by copying & pasting this link:

You only need to register once and each time you test, it will take no longer than 15 minutes. Students signed up for the program will be taken over to the Hall during the morning by a staff member to get tested. If you are a parent volunteer and want to get tested, you just need to go directly to the hall at 8 am. Results are generated and provided to both those that have been tested and the school. Please note this program is free for all participants. Thank you for helping us stay safe and prevent outbreaks!

Sick Child(ren) Reminder

As per COVID health guidelines, if your child(ren) is(are) not feeling well before they come to school (headache, coughing, sneezing, sore throat, fever of 100.4 or above, body aches,

If they are presenting any of these symptoms, they will need to have a negative COVID-19 test result before returning to school.

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Epiphany

We celebrate the Epiphany a few days earlier today than the traditional day, January 6th, the twelfth night of Christmas. Mathew's Gospel lays out a bit of history, explaining Herod's desire to use the Magi to bring him intelligence about the whereabouts of this new King. The term "epiphany" can be used when one feels suddenly that one understands or becomes conscious of something important.

The Magi were a high-ranking, priestly class who served Kings. They were regarded as being able to recognize the signs of the times. The Magi from the East were Gentiles, and they did not know the Scriptures. However, they had alternative ways of

knowing — the mystery of a star to find Jesus, and dreams to "take a different way" to avoid Herod. Matthew is highlighting that all do not come to Jesus by the same way. God uses unexpected means.

Leonardo Da Vinci's "The Adoration of the Magi" is helpful in getting a good picture of this time.

In the foreground many people surround the baby Jesus. In the

background behind Jesus, Mary, and the Magi, we see crumbling

buildings and men fighting on horseback. Da Vinci captures a

perspective we often don't think about. Jesus the Messiah comes into a world of chaos and decay which needs change.

What would we paint into the background to tell the story of the Magi? Painting something that might have relevance today. How might our reflection during this Christmas season lead us more deeply into right relationships with God, God's people, and the land?

St. Matthew tells us that "Overwhelmed by joy" the Magi entered "the household" —The Magi prostrate themselves, paying Jesus' homage, and

"opening their treasure chests, whereby they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh." The coming of the Gentiles is part of the vision of God's justice being restored on earth

In many nations and in many cultures, the Feast of the Epiphany (Three King's Day) is celebrated with greater solemnity than Christmas. Just as Christmas celebrates the special manifestation of Jesus to the Jews, so Epiphany celebrates his special

manifestation to the Gentiles. What was begun by Jesus in his time must be continued by us in our time. If Jesus is to be made known to all nations, it must be through our efforts. We must carry to the nations of the world the "GOOD NEWS" that Jesus, the Son of God, took flesh and lived among us. Jesus came to set up God's kingdom on earth. He came to set up a new world, one in which there would be no more grief, no more pain, no more sorrow - one in which the needy would receive what they need. This is the practical message of the Feast of the Epiphany. It is a message that calls each of us to action. I leave you with this quote written by an unknown poet.

"When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with the flocks, the work of Christmas begins: "to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoners, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among brothers, to make music in the heart."

May you and your family experience a beautiful Epiphany.
