COVID TESTING PRIOR TO RETURNING FROM BREAK...

We would to thank you for your cooperation with our COVID-19 policies. We have had many sick children (not COVID related) who have been out recently with regular colds and flu. Remember, all of the symptoms of colds and flu are COVID

related. It is important to have your children tested if they exhibit any symptoms and it is the school policy prior to their return to school.

In anticipation of the Christmas holiday and vacation, we are providing every student with a COVID test kit. We ask that you test your child(ren) on Monday, Jan. 2nd, to make sure they are negative before returning from the holiday break. Test kits will be inside the family envelope

which went home today.

ONSITE COVID TESTING

We are also still offering free COVID Testing on campus here at St. Louise every Friday. If you wish to ave your child(ren) participate, you need to pre-register for testing. The website link is:

Testing takes place in the parish hall and take place every Friday at 8:00 am. This weekly testing is a free program through Heluna Health open to all on campus (vaccinated or unvaccinated), which includes staff, students, and any parents who volunteer on our campus. You only need to register once and each time you test, it will take no longer than 15 minutes. Students signed up for the program will be taken over to the Hall during the morning by a staff member to get tested. If you are a parent volunteer and want to get tested, you just need to go directly to the hall at 8 am. Results are generated and provided to both those that have been tested and the school. Please note this program is free for all participants. Testing is not required, but highly encouraged.

This is so that all staff may attend the faculty Christmas party. Please make appropriate arrangements to have your child(ren) picked up at the 12 noon dismissal time that day.



Our Lost and Found is Over flowing!!




afternoon will be put in uniform exchange or donated.





SIMBANG GABI

St. Louise is once again joining with local parishes in a Novena of Masses in preparation for the birth of our Savior.

St. Louise's Simbang Gabi celebration will be held at the 4:30 PM Mass on Saturday,

December 17th, with a reception following.

During this Christmas season, Filipinos continue to celebrate this annual Novena Mass, "Simbang Gabi," a tradition they brought with them from the Philippines. Simbang Gabi was adapted from the Catholic Misa de Gallo, which literally means "Mass of the Rooster," to indicate it is held when the rooster crows.


The tradition started in the Philippines in the 16th century. It gave the farmers a chance to hear Mass before setting out for the fields. Rural Filipinos were used to starting the day two hours before sunrise. Church bells rang to call the faithful to Simbang Gabi. In some provinces, brass bands played traditional Christmas music and parish priests would go as faras knocking on the doors of every home.

During this season, Filipinos create beautiful decorations called "parol", paper lanterns to commemorate the Star of Bethlehem. These lanterns were used by the farmers to guide them in the dark to the Holy Mass. Choirs sang Tagalog songs such as Pasko na Naman" (It's Christmas Again).

PASTOR'S CORNER



There are two great Marian Feast Days we celebrate during Advent. The first, which happened this past week, is the Immaculate Conception on December 8th. The second, that we celebrate tomorrow, is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. It feels appropriate that we honor Mary during this Advent season because her pregnancy is what gives us the earth-shattering event of the birth of Jesus!

The dogma of the Immaculate Conception asserts that, "from the first moment of her conception, the Blessed Virgin Mary was, by the singular grace and privilege of Almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of Mankind, kept free from all stain of original sin." Pope Pius IX defined the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, INEFFABILIS DEUS, on December 8, 1854.

In 1521, Spanish conquistadores invaded the lands that are now known as Mexico. The Spanish invasion was brutal and decimated the indigenous population. On December 12, 1531, ten years after the Spanish invasion, Juan Diego walked near Tepeyac. He heard a voice calling out his name.

Juan climbed to the top of the hill and there met a beautiful young woman whose clothing shone with the radiance of the sun. The lady asked Juan Diego to travel to the Spanish Bishop and instruct him to rebuild her temple at Tepeyac, her sacred hillside. "There I will listen to the cries and lamentations of your people, in order to cure all their various pains, miseries, and sorrows," she said.

After two failed attempts to speak with the Bishop, Mary said to Juan Diego, "Am I not here, who am your Mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? Am I not the fountain of life? Are you not in the folds of my mantle—in the crossing of my arms?"

She asked him to make one last trip to the Bishop and gave him an armful of roses miraculously growing in the dead of a dry winter. She instructed him to deliver the roses to the Bishop and to ask the Bishop to build her temple. Juan filled his tilma—or outer robe—with the roses.

Juan went back to the Bishop a third time and waited. He was finally granted an audience. When he entered the chambers, he dropped the roses at the Bishop's feet. As the roses fell to the ground, the Bishop dropped to his knees, as did all the other men in the Bishop's company. There, on Juan Diego's tilma, was the image of the Lady herself—just as she had looked when she was speaking to him.

Mary's instructions were followed by the bishop. The temple was built for her on the hillside of Tepeyac. Later, a larger basilica was built near Tepeyac. The original tilma worn by Juan Diego with the Lady's image, remains intact and on display at the basilica.

Let us remember to honor Mary during these Advent days. She is a vital piece of our Salvation history.
