Welcome to St Louise Athletics! We are excited to have 90 students participating in our athletic program. That is great!!!! We are very excited about the upcoming seasons! We will be meeting all challenges head on with a great spirit. It was incredible to see all the exciting faces as we started practices this past week. Coach Sergio will be sending out a weekly schedule for all sports teams. The schedule will go out at some point during the weekend.



A little about each team:

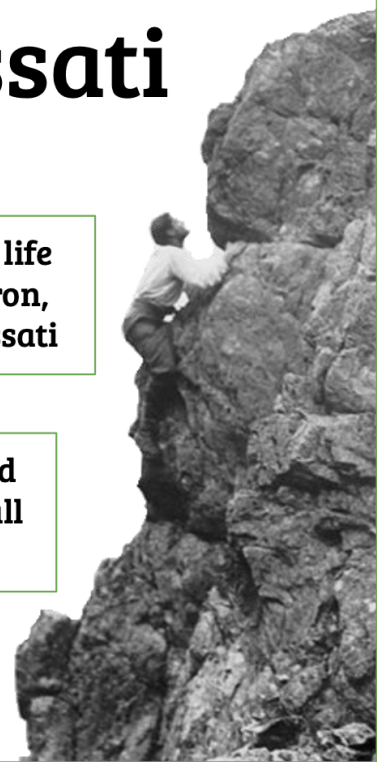

Labor Day and Catholic Social Justice Teaching

As summer ends, we celebrate many things. Special among them is that children are back in school. This may be the one thing many of us have yearned for the most! I have to say, I love seeing and hearing the children on our campus once again. I believe I speak for all of the school staff and teachers, when I say the past year has been difficult, and even with taking necessary precautions in the school, everyone feels excited about having our children back.

We also celebrate Labor Day in one week. This holiday celebrates all of the workers in America.

The right to dignified work and adequate compensation has always been part of the Social Justice teaching of the Church. 1986, the United States Catholic Bishops published the Pastoral Letter, *Economic Justice for All*. The letter states: "The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected—the right to productive work, to decent wages.

Both Popes Benedict XVI and Pope Francis have expanded our understanding of this right. Pope Benedict stated in his encyclical, *Caritas in Veritate* (Charity in Truth), "Profit is useful if it serves as a means towards an end, but once profit becomes the exclusive goal, if it is produced by improper means and without the common good as its ultimate end, it risks destroying wealth and creating poverty."

Pope Francis stated in his encyclical, *Laudato Si* (Praise Be to You) *On Care for our Common Home*, "work should be the setting for...rich personal growth... We were created with a vocation to work... Helping the poor financially must always be a provisional solution in the face of pressing needs. The broader objective should always be to allow them a dignified life through work."

So, what can we do to help in the fight for economic justice? Learning about our Catholic teaching is just the first aspect. The following list suggests areas you can get involved in. 1) Domestic poverty, 2) Hunger, food & nutrition, 3) Work & joblessness, 4) Housing & homelessness and 5) Unemployment & poverty.

In all these areas, you can get involved by writing, calling, or emailing your elected representatives. Many times, discussions around the Federal Budget and about the various Covid Rescue packages have elements that affect American workers and the unemployed that you can respond to.

It has been stirring to watch how all sorts of people came together to distribute food during the pandemic. People are still hungry and need help. While some people have returned to work, many have not, and the jobs people have been getting frequently pay less than the job held before the pandemic. You can help out by volunteering at food pantries and distribution centers.

Homelessness in Los Angeles is at a crisis level. Look for organizations that are organizing around this issue. Can you volunteer to take a shift at a shelter? Contacting Catholic Charities and/or The Catholic Worker might provide ideas about how you can help. Be persistent in calling. These organizations are staffed by volunteers and sometimes you have to try more than once to get through. All charitable organizations need money. Donating money is a good way to help others.

As you celebrate this Labor Day, remember the day celebrates work, and we as Catholics believe the opportunity to work is necessary for achieving dignity.

DID YOU KNOW?

Teach children how to answer the door safely

You would never knowingly let someone dangerous or unsafe into your home. But it is impossible to fully vet every stranger — maintenance worker, new neighbor, salesperson, etc. — who shows up at your door. Teach children a few tips about answering (or not answering) the doorbell. Consider these rules, or something similar, for your family: Always look to see who is at the door first. If the person is a stranger, get an adult to answer the door. Do not open the door to someone you do not know.
