A meal train has been started for one of our school families. Mrs.



Hernandez, mother of Aiden Hernandez (Gr. 8) was released from UCLA Medical Center just before Christmas; but, is still very weak. She is still very optimistic and hopeful that she will regain some of her strength and hopefully be able to walk again and possibly drive.

COVID, FLU, & COLD REMINDER...

We continue to have an increase in sick children coming in to school. Most have been coughs and colds, however, we have had a couple of positive COVID-19 cases recently. If your child becomes ill, please test for COVID-19. A home test is sufficient.

Even if your child is negative for COVID-19, please keep your children at home until symptoms (fever, cough, sore throat, etc.) are better and children have been fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medicine. Remember, we want to lessen the spread of regular germs too. If your child does test positive for COVID-19, we ask that you please notify the school office at princi-pal@stlouisedm.org.

If a positive child or adult has been on campus in the past 48 hours, the school will notify the community of a positive case via email. If your child is identified as a "close contact" you will receive a separate email. Close contacts can remain in school but will need to wear a mask for a period of 5 days while on campus (the school can provide masks). Symptoms should be monitored, and close contacts should test after day 5 of exposure.






Baptism of the Lord

From the first moment of Christ's conception to this day, people have been involved in bringing the message of Christ to fruition. And this will continue until the Kingdom of God is achieved here on earth. We are called to make this possible.

Mary was chosen by God to be the mother of his son, Jesus Christ. Joseph took on his role as collaborator as the human father of the baby Jesus. He and Mary went to Bethlehem for the census,

and someone gave them a place to stay while Mary gave birth. So already, we know three people involved in making this miracle happen. When Mary and Joseph fled to Egypt, as migrants, there must have been people who helped them get settled. The stayed there for about 3 ½ years, and then returned to Nazareth, according to Matthew.

Now enters John the Baptist. John has been preaching that the people needed to turn back to God. He always directed his followers to God and God's laws not towards himself. John had to have known Jesus since they were cousins but did not appear to know that the Messiah he was waiting for would be Jesus! He did not know until he baptized Jesus and the dove descended upon him. John always had his eye on what was important. God promised his chosen people that they would be saved. Probably most Jews at the time expected someone who would help them throw off the oppression of living in an occupied land. As soon as he recognized Jesus to be that Savior, he pointed out Jesus to his followers as the promised one.



In today's Gospel, John says in verse 29, "John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." Not your sin, not my sin, not the Roman's sins but the whole world's sin. In verses 32-34, "John testified further, saying, 'I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him. I did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.' Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."

Obviously, John the Baptist is one of the collaborators. From the moment Jesus entered his public life, we humans have been asked to be collaborators of the coming Kingdom of God. Jesus called others to follow him. He asked those followers to remember the God they worshiped and presented God in a different way, the God of love, mercy, and forgiveness.

You and I are called to that same message, 2000 years later. In Jesus' name scores of followers have spread throughout the

world preaching this message of Christ. Today there are about 2.3 billion Christians in the world. We are different denominations, but we all follow Christ. I believe time is insignificant to our creator who lives forever. A day can seem like 1000's of years; a 1,000 years can seem like a single day. But for our sake, we need to work harder at being the people God wants us to be. Each of us needs to work harder at removing divisions among us. Each of us needs to work harder for peace in this world. We need to do more to save this planet. We need to make sure all people have enough to live a dignified life. We do not want another 2,000 years to pass and still not have achieved what Christ called us to be. So, let us move forward in this Ordinary Time reflecting on how we can do just that.

DID YOU KNOW?

Understanding the VIRTUS "Protecting God's Children" Program

Child sexual abusers often target nurturing, childfriendly environments, where parents participants assume that no one would ever want to harm a child. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles began implementing the VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children sexual abuse prevention program in 2004 to send a message to potential predators that child sexual abuse is not tolerated. Through this program, adults learn that through early identification, awareness, and education they can be "proactive" in protecting children and young people from child sexual abuse. Since the program began, more than 405,000 adults have been trained in abuse prevention.


Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur.
