Daniella Brown was recognized for always being on task and always being a kind and helpful to her friends. Keep up the awesome attitude Daniella!

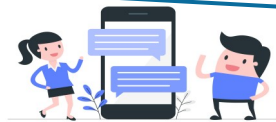


Ariah Morelos was recognized for showing great improvement in all subjects area. Ariah is participating more often and is focused during lessons and centers. Fantastic work, Ariah!

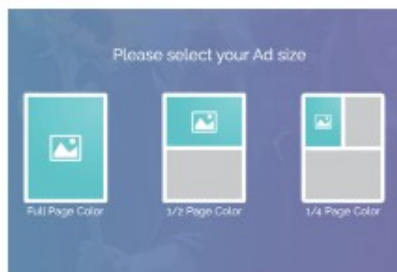

BLESSING OF THROATS

Blessing of the Throats will be on Saturday, February 3rd after the 8:30 AM Mass.

The blessing of the throats is done on St. Blaise's Feast Day. Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life, but according to various accounts, he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His cult spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.

The Crime of Child Pornography

Child pornography is the visual depiction of a minor in sexually explicit conduct. There is some general public confusion surrounding the term "child pornography" — for example, some people believe that child pornography can be accidentally found while browsing the internet, or that the "children" depicted are actually older and simply appear younger. Using the term "child pornography" can also minimize the horrors of children being exploited for profit in this way.
