Morning Drop Off & Afternoon Pick-Up Procedures Reminder...

We have had several incidents of parents circumventing some of these safety procedures and we are worried there will be an injury to someone!

Below are some important reminders about our Morning Drop Off & Afternoon Pick-Up procedures & regulations. PLEASE spend a few minutes reading it so you are aware on them to ensure the safety of students, faculty/staff, and parents/family members while dropping off or picking up your child(ren).

- For cars entering and exiting the morning and afternoon drop-off zones, cars MUST enter from the far east driveway on Covina Blvd (the driveway nearest the Kindergarten classroom and rectory) to the Drop-Off Zone located at the south side of the planters & fire lane). DO NOT PARK IN THE FACULTY PARKING (THE AREA NEAREST THE RECTORY) TO DROP YOUR CHILD(REN) OFF. DO NOT PARK BY THE FAITH FORMATION OFFICE TO DROP OFF YOUR CHILDREN. All cars will exit onto Bonnie Cove.
- Cars will enter from this driveway and proceed to the drop-off area in the driveway area parallel to planters.
- Please pull all the way up to the next available spot. After dropping your child(ren), please wait for the car in front of you to exit. Under no circumstances should cars try to pass other cars in the drop off line.
- Children should exit on the passenger side of the car only. Upon dropping your child off in the drop off zone, you must exit via Bonnie Cove.
- If you wish to walk your child to the drop off area or need to access your trunk, We ask that you park in a stall in the parking lot nearest to the church. PLEasE DO NOT PARK AT THE CURB BEHIND THE PARISH CENTER TO DROP OFF YOUR CHILD(REN) THIS CAUSES OTHER CARS TO BE BACKED UP BEHIND YOU!
- It is extremely important that younger siblings be watched closely while walking to and from your parked car. Upon exiting the parking lot after walking your child in, you must get back in line to exit via Bonnie Cove.
- No cars are permitted to drop off on Bonnie Cove to walk onto the campus. They are also NOT ALLOWED to walk from any parked car WITHOUT being accompanied by an adult.

Carline will open approximately 5-10 minutes before the end of the school days, as some classes are still outside for P.E. classes. Please do not come earlier and remove the cones/barricades to drive through as we cannot have children in the parking lot area with moving cars.

We are so excited to welcome our grandparents and the special people in our children's lives. We would like to continue on with our tradition of providing them a special reception on their visit.



PASTOR'S CORNER



Following the Teachings of Christ

Today, in 1 Corinthians, we read that most of us were not born wise, not born wealthy, not born powerful. But God chose the foolish, the weak, the lowly and those despised. It is through Jesus Christ we receive wisdom, righteousness, sanctification and are redeemed.

Next, we look to the Gospel preaching the Beatitudes. Jesus taught those who were poor in spirit can claim the kingdom of heaven; He says it is the poor in spirit, the mourners, the meek, those who thirst for righteousness, those who are merciful, clean of heart, peacemakers, the persecuted who will be rewarded. Jesus says we should "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

It is through Jesus that we receive power. The power to follow the Beatitudes, which is plenty hard enough! During Ordinary time, the Gospels follow the ministry of Jesus as he attracts followers, travels from place to place preaching a message of the love of God and his mercy and a promise of forgiveness. At the same time, he tells us how to behave so we, too, can live forever in the Kingdom.



It is valuable to look to the Saints for clues on how we should live. This past week, we celebrated the feast day of St. Thomas Aguinas and the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle.

Thomas was born into a family of nobles and a person of means. It was though education that he met the Dominican Friars and decided to join them when he was 19. Thomas's choice did not please his family. While on a journey to Rome, he was kidnapped by his brothers as he was drinking from a spring. They took him back to his parents. Thomas was held prisoner for almost one year and eventually he was released. Thomas was not poor but given his choice of Religious life and his desire to teach and write, we may assume he was poor in spirit.

St Paul is one of the true Disciples of Christ, though he never met him and was originally searching for and persecuting Christ's Disciples before his conversion. However, while travelling, he was struck by a bright light, and fell to the ground, blinded. The Risen Christ commanded him to travel to Damascus. There, Ananias, a follower of the early Christian church, restored his sight. Paul is considered one of the most influential leaders of the early Christian church. He was crucial in spreading the gospel to the Gentiles. His journeys took him throughout the Roman Empire. Paul suffered persecution himself as he spread the word, sharing the teachings of Jesus Christ. He was a prolific writer and we read many of his letters in the New Testament. His conversion and works are chronicled in the Acts of the Apostles.

I believe we can agree that Paul followed the teachings of the Beatitudes, especially as one who was persecuted for righteousness.

So, what does this mean to us? The Beatitudes are a guidebook, to teach us how we should be living our lives as Christians. Along with the parables of Christ, we are taught to be humble, meek, merciful and to be peacemakers. Christ repeatedly told us to

forgive those who have caused us harm (as he did for us.) He tells us to take care of the stranger, the sick, those who are poor, and the imprisoned. We need to make the effort to follow the teachings of Christ, and never give up on trying. We know God blesses us our efforts.



BLESSING OF THROATS

Blessing of the Throats will be on Friday, February 3rd, after the 8:30 AM and 7 PM Masses.

The blessing of the throats is done on St. Blaise's Feast Day. Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts, he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His cult spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.


