



24-25 GRADELINK ONLINE RE-REGISTRATION!

Mrs. Ossa will be giving more information about the 2024-2025 online re-registration at the "State of the School" meeting on Monday, March 4th, at 6:30 pm in the Msgr. Pierce Hall.

The online reenrollment period through Gradelink will be open starting Tuesday, March 5th, and end on Friday, March 15th. Once activated, current families will be able to access an "EnrollMe" tab within their parent account to register their child(ren) for the 2024-2025 school year.

More information on how to re-enroll using the Gradelink online system will be in upcoming "Happenings" newsletters and will be emailed to all families on Tuesday morning, March 5th.

Upon completing your online re-registration AND paying your fees in your Blackbaud account, your paperwork package will be sent home with your oldest child. The re-registration fee will increase for anyone registering after April 19th.

Your re-registration will not be finalized for the 2024-2025 school year until you have completed all information for each child in Gradelink; paid all fees through your Blackbaud Tuition Management account; and, turned in all paperwork at the "Service Hours" Sign-Up Night which will be held from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm on Tuesday, April 9th.

Medication Policy...

Just a reminder about medication (whether prescription or "over-the-counter") - All students must follow our policy which is:



- No medication, including cough syrup, cough drops, Tylenol, etc., may be given to any student unless there is a Doctor's signature, with the name of medication, dosage and time to be given. This information, along with the medication, is kept in the Health Room. The form can be obtained from the school office.
- NO medication may be kept in the classrooms, book bags, or with a student (unless child has a doctor's note on file).

REMINDERS ABOUT POLICIES REGARDING CELL PHONES & ELECTRONIC DEVICES

In the last several months, we have had an increase in students using their own devices cell phones, smart watches, and laptops/Chromebooks to contact parents for various reasons. We would like to remind parents and the students about the policies regarding such devices:

CELL PHONES/SMART WATCHES

- ♦ Cell phones and smart watches MAY NOT be used on campus before or during school except in cases of extreme emergency as identified by school personnel. (i.e., earthquake, fire, disaster) Students may not call home except in an emergency. A student may never call or text without permission from a supervising adult employee of the school during school hours. Continued violation of the cell phone policy may result in confiscation of the phone for the day.
- ♦ Students may not call home for forgotten items (i.e. P.E. clothes, books, schoolwork). Rides need to be arranged in advance. Children may not make personal, after school arrangements using the office telephone.

LAPTOPS/CHROMEBOOKS, etc.

The following rules are for technology use in the classroom:

- The school is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damage to devices.
- Devices must be kept on the desk at all times.
- ♦ The camera must remain off at all times, unless instructed otherwise by a teacher.
- All screen savers and wallpaper must be appropriate.
- Required Apps must be downloaded prior to use in classroom. Only school approved apps can be used while on campus.
- Devices are to be used for educational purposes only.
- Devices are to be used in the classroom only; they are not to be taken out to recess or lunch.
- Devices are to be fully charged at all times.

Please spend some time discussing these policies with your students so they are aware of the appropriate usage of these devices during school hours. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

PASTOR'S CORNER



War and Peace

Every morning I awake to news about the wars in Gaza and Ukraine. Every time I turn on the news, I am barraged with pictures of suffering of people engaged in war torn places. If I pick up the newspaper, I am once again drenched in war news.

I believe we are all tired of the wars raging in Europe and the Middle East. And that doesn't even count the wars we don't hear about in Africa, or the drug wars in Latin and South America and so on.

Reasonable people know this must stop.

When Hamas committed the atrocity of invading Israel, killing 1200 people, men women and children, the world looked on in horror and understood Israel's call for taking action to defend itself. While the bombing of apartment buildings, medical facilities and Houses of Worship was shocking, most could understand it. But then the body count started piling up. At what point does this attack stop being defense and become revenge and retribution?

Ukraine certainly had the right to protect its borders from Russia's attack. With lots of armaments supplied by NATO allies, they have amazingly held back Russia from running over their country. But after two years, as the body count piles up, one must wonder, is there another way?

It would be helpful to look at the Catholic Church's attitude towards war, today. Our Pontifical leader, Pope Francis, has made clear where he stands and urges us to stand with him. Pope Francis calls all forms of war a "crime against humanity," and urges humanity to learn how to desire peace through education that rejects violence.

Pope Francis said the effort to bring the wars in Ukraine and

Gaza to an end and save civilians must not stop. "War itself is a denial of humanity," he said. "Let us not tire of praying for peace, for an end to conflicts, for a halt to weapons, and for relief for exhausted populations." Ending the wars in Ukraine and Gaza have been a constant theme of Pope Francis in numerous talks.

Pope Francis also renewed his appeal for the immediate release of all Israeli hostages, saying "Let all hostages, who had seen hope in the truce a few weeks ago, be freed immediately, so that this great suffering for Israelis and Palestinians might come to an end."

"No to weapons, yes to peace", Pope Francis says, renewing his appeal for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza, and the release of all hostages there.

He goes on to say, "We must educate for peace. It seems that we are not yet—all of humanity—with sufficient education to stop every war. Let us always pray for this grace: to educate for peace."

We might want to join in with our Pope in praying for peace and demanding a ceasefire to all aggressions. It is time for diplomats to step in and begin negotiating with all parties. Gazans' existence depends on a ceasefire. Ukrainians may be tiring of the specter of a forever war. We might want to let our elected representatives know that ending war is a moral imperative for us.
