ONSITE COVID TESTING

Testing is held in the Hall every Friday at 8:00 am. This weekly

testing is a free program through Heluna and Primary Health open to all on campus (vaccinated or unvaccinated), which includes staff, students, and any parents who volunteer on our campus. This program also satisfies the testing requirements for those who are in our athletic programs. If you wish to participate in the program, you need to pre-register for testing by copying & pasting this link:

https://my.primary.health/l/saint louise de marillac school

You only need to register once and each time you test, it will take no longer than 15 minutes. Students signed up for the program will be taken over to the Hall during the morning by a staff member to get tested. If you are a parent volunteer and want to get tested, you just need to go directly to the hall at 8 am. Results are generated and provided to both those that have been tested and the school. Please note this program is free for all participants. Thank you for helping us stay safe and prevent outbreaks!

REQUIRED VACCINATION/NEGATIVE TEST RESULTS FOR ALL ON-CAMPUS VOLUNTEERS...

If you are a school volunteer and are assisting us with any job on campus (lunch duty, health room, coaches etc.) you are REQUIRED to provide proof of vaccination. If you have been fully vaccinated, please provide a copy of your vaccination card ASAP if you have not yet done so.

If you are not vaccinated and would like to continue to be an on-campus volunteer, we ask that you show proof of a negative COVID-19 test each week to continue to volunteer on campus. You can sign up for our onsite COVID testing each Friday.

Free At Home Testing Kits... Residential households in the U.S. can order one set of 4 free at-home tests from USPS.com.

Here's what you need to know about your order:

One order includes:

4 individual rapid antigen COVID-19 tests



Feast of our Lady of Lourdes

This past Friday, we celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The story of Lourdes is simple; On a February 11, 1858, a young, poor girl named Bernadette Soubirous was out collecting firewood with her sister and another friend near a grotto when she saw a vision of a lovely lady. St. Bernadette described this first meeting, "I raised my head and looked towards the grotto. I saw a Lady dressed in white, wearing a white dress, a blue girdle and a yellow rose on each foot, the same color as the chain of her Rosary." In the vision Our Lady was praying the rosary.

Bernadette shared what she saw with her parents, who, at first, forbade her to return to the Grotto. They relented on February 14th and allowed her to return.

Bernadette saw the Lady again, and she returned again on

February 18th. At that third apparition, the Lady asked Bernadette to return each day for 2 weeks. At these subsequent visits the Lady (who had not yet identified herself as the Blessed Virgin Mary) asked for a chapel to be built on the grounds, for Bernadette to pray for the conversion of sinners, and for her to drink the spring water that was revealed to her at the grotto.

Bernadette was interrogated for her story, which officials did not believe. However, many of the townspeople believed that Mary was appearing to Bernadette, and they came down in large numbers to the grotto to pray. The spring that the Lady asked Bernadette to drink from quickly revealed itself to be blessed water with miraculous healing properties.

Mary appeared for the last time on March 25th, the Feast of the Annunciation. This time she identified herself as the Virgin Mary and the Immaculate Conception. Bernadette reported this visitation by saying, "With her two arms hanging down, she

raised her eyes and looked up at the sky, and it was then that she told me, joining her hands together now at the height of her breast, that she was the Immaculate Conception. Those were the last words she ever said to me."

Our Lady of Lourdes

The first reported apparition of Mary acknowledged by the Catholic Church was in Guadalupe, Mexico in 1531. This is one of the most popular Feast Days celebrated here in the Southland. Our Lady of Fatima is probably the next best-known apparition of Mary who appeared to 3 shepherd children in 1917. But you may be surprised to know that there are 17 approved apparitions recognized by the Catholic Church. The most recent of these was in 1981 in Kibeho, Rwanda, where once again she appeared to children exhorting them to pray the rosary.

Why do we celebrate these Feast Days? The sites where Mary appeared become places pilgrims go to deepen their faith. In Lourdes, the healing waters of the spring bring 4 to 6 million people, annually, to the shrine, many seeking a healing by bathing in the spring's water. Approximately 200 million have visited the shrine since 1860. Lourdes is the most popular pilgrimage site. I believe we Catholics connect to Mary through these Feast Days; days where we can acknowledge her as the caring mother, not just of Jesus, but of the Church and all of us. I don't think it is by accident that she has appeared so often to poor children. Mary is like an ambassador carrying the message of Jesus to us. She tells us God wants to hear our prayers. God responds to our prayers.

In all three of the apparitions mentioned here, Mary asked for prayers; even requesting Churches to built on the sites where the faithful could gather to pray. Most of us will never get the chance to go to Lourdes. However, each of us can pray, just as she asked.


