PASTOR'S CORNER



The Presentation of the Lord

On February 2nd, we celebrated the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This is an important feast day for many reasons.

Jesus as Savior was revealed in three different events. The first time was by the shepherds who visited the baby in the manger immediately following his birth after receiving an announcement delivered by an Angel. The second was the visit by the three Magi, who followed a star, found the baby and gave him gifts appropriate for a King.

The third time was when Jesus was presented at the temple and Simeon proclaimed, "for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." (Lk 2: 30-32) Simeon was inspired by the Holy Spirit who told him he would not die before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. Also in the temple was a prophetess, Anna, and quoted in the Gospel, it is said, "And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem." (Lk 2: 38) Her speaking to all who were waiting was the first public affirmation of Jesus as the Savior.

So how did it come about that Jesus was presented at the temple? According to Jewish law, 40 days after the birth of a child, the mother was to go to the temple to be purified. And the first male child was to be presented at the temple to be redeemed. According to Luke, "Mary and Joseph took the baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem forty days after his birth to complete Mary's ritual purification after childbirth, and to perform the redemption of the firstborn, in obedience to the Law of Moses."

It may seem contradictory that Mary, the pure, would have to be purified. Or that Jesus, the redeemer, had to have redemption. But it was important for the Gospel writers to make sure everyone knew Jesus and his family were faithful Jews. They lived by the Laws of Moses and the Torah, their sacred texts. Jesus may have pointed out during his ministry years the hypocrisy of the Jewish leaders or the misplaced devotions of Jews who cared more about outward piety than inner charity, but at no time did he renounce his faith. Jesus was Jewish.

The first reading of the day was from the book of Malachi. This reading prophesied the coming of the Messiah. "And suddenly there will come to the temple the LORD whom you seek, and the messenger of the covenant whom you desire. Yes, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts." (Mal 3:1) So Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus to the temple fulfilled that prophesy.

This feast day's celebration is filled with stories. Purification, redemption, Simeon and Anna, prophets, and prophesies. I have often said you should read the Bible. There is a richness in our sacred texts which is our heritage that all of us should take advantage.
