The online reenrollment period through Gradelink will be open starting Tuesday, March 8th, and end on Friday, March 25th. Once activated, current families will be able to access an "EnrollMe" tab within their parent account to register their child(ren) for the 2022-2023 school year.

More information on how to re-enroll using the Gradelink online system will be in upcoming "Happenings" newsletters and will be emailed to all families on Tuesday morning, March 8th.

Your re-registration will not be finalized for the 2022-2023 school year until you have completed all information for each child in Gradelink; paid all fees through your Blackbaud Tuition Management account; and, turned in all paperwork at the "Service Hours" Sign-Up Night which will be held from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm on Thursday, March 31st.



2022-2023 Financial Aid Applications

The Financial Aid applications for the 2022-2023 school year for the Catholic Education Foundation financial aid grants and St. Louise de Marillac financial aid is now up on the school website!

In order to be considered for St. Louise financial aid, you must apply for CEF financial aid. In addition to the completed CEF application, St. Louise requires a complete set of your taxes and a detailed letter stating why you are requesting aid. All of this documentation must be submitted no later than Thursday, March 24, 2022.

Completed applications & documentation must be turned in to the Finance Office at the Parish Center. The School Office will not be accepting applications.

Applications that are not completely filled out and/or are missing necessary documentation will not be accepted. Please note that necessary documentation is different for each application.

PASTOR'S CORNER



Ash Wednesday and the Season of Lent

The season of Lent has a twofold character: repentance and forgiveness. This starts with Ash Wednesday which we celebrate this coming Wednesday. We are marked with ashes that acknowledges we are sinners. This is public witness to our Christian and Catholic Faith. Today, I want us to go on a journey with the scripture that frames the Season of Lent as a time of penance. I will do this by reviewing the Gospel Acclamation verse that precedes the Gospel each week.

We start with Ash Wednesday. The verse reads, "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." (Ps 95:8) We need to be open to this time and ponder what God is trying to tell us.

On the First Sunday, we hear, "One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God." (Mt 4:4b) In the Gospel we read that Jesus went into the desert for 40 days. He is tempted by the Devil, but he relies on the word of God. This begins our own journey of relying on God. throughout the entire season of Lent.

On the Second Sunday we hear, "From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: This is my beloved Son, hear him." (Mt 17:5) This Sunday we hear the Gospel of the Transfiguration. We are called to hear the voice of God and follow the Son just as the disciples did.

As we move to the Third Sunday the Gospel Acclamation proclaims, "Repent, says the Lord; the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Mt 4:17) This is a pretty clear call for us to repent. Reconciliation is the way we are redeemed.

On the Fourth Sunday, the verse states, "I will get up and go to my Father and shall say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you." (Lk 15:18) The Gospel this week tells the parable of the Prodigal son. I have found it comforting to believe that we are always welcomed back; all we have to do is acknowledge our sin, that we made a mistake and forgiveness will be ours. Father, I have sinned against God and against you

The theme of repentance and forgiveness continues on the Fifth

Sunday. "Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart; for I am gracious and merciful." (Joel 2:12-13) The Gospel tells the story of the adulteress woman that the townspeople want to stone. Jesus says, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Jesus is once again saying we are worthy of redemption.

I don't know how many ways we can be told to repent. God's forgiveness is ours if we only humble ourselves and ask for forgiveness. Let us be sure this Lenten Season to take advantage of this gift of repentance. As Catholics, we find this in the sacrament of Reconciliation. We all need it. May this Lenten Season be fruitful for you.

Stations of the Cross is a Lenten devotion that offers witness to Jesus' Passion and Death. At each station we use our senses and our imagination to reflect prayerfully upon Jesus' suffering, Death, and Resurrection, and to simply experience the visual images to reflect on Christ's love for us.
