2024-2025 Financial Aid Applications

The Financial Aid applications for the 2024-2025 school year for the Catholic Education Foundation financial aid grants and St. Louise de Marillac financial aid is now up on the school website!

In order to be considered for St. Louise financial aid, you must apply for CEF financial aid. In addition to the completed CEF application, St. Louise requires a complete set of your taxes and a detailed letter stating why you are requesting aid. All of this documentation must be submitted **no later than Thursday, March 21, 2024.**

Completed applications & documentation must be turned in to the Finance Office at the Parish Center. The School Office will not be accepting applications.

Applications that are not completely filled out and/or are missing necessary documentation will not be accepted. Please note that necessary documentation is different for each application.

Re-Enrolling An Existing Student

Existing families will see the **Re-Enroll** tab on the left sidebar in their **Parent Portal** when they log in. From there, they can begin the process of re-enrolling their student. Below is what will appear when you first enter the EnrollMe section: Because information for each child in your family may be slightly different (i.e. health information), you will need to complete the process for each child before completing the online portion of your 2024-2025 re-registration.

If adding a new student(s) (sibling), you will need to adjust the amount accordingly (i.e. if you are paying for two students, you would adjust the payment to \$850). Enrolling a Brand New Student With An Existing Student In the School

Existing families that have children already in the school can add other children not currently enrolled. Because you are enrolling a new student, you will need to create a temporary registration account for registering the new student as the information for the new student is not yet in Gradelink. This is the same process that prospective families go through when enrolling their chil-



dren. Keep in mind that the login credentials used to log into your Parent Portal will not work here.

1. Parents will log-in to their *Parent Portal* using their Gradelink login username and password.

2. They will then click the **Re-Enroll** tab on the left sidebar.

3. They will click the *Have a new student to enroll?* link at the top right of the page.

4. They will then follow the steps outlined in <u>Enrolling a New Student</u>.

PASTOR'S CORNER



How Do We Act Upon Life Issues

As we all know, Catholics are concerned with all aspects of Life issues. From abortion to the death penalty, we champion a dignified life. Frequently, we think only of abortion when we speak of the right to life, but our position on life is much bigger than that. So, what do we do about Life issues?

Prayer should always be the place where you start. But action is just as much a part of a Catholic's responsibility. We believe prayer and good works are connected to make us faithful Catholics. The

Corporal Works of Mercy are found in the teachings of Jesus and give us a model for how we should treat all others, as if they were Christ in disguise. Here are the seven listed.

Feed the Hungry: There are many people in this world who go without food. Try not to purchase more food than you are able to eat. If you notice that you end up throwing groceries away each week, purchasing less groceries will eliminate waste and allow you to donate the savings to those in need. Give donations to organizations that serve food to the homeless or poor.



Give Drink to the Thirsty: Many of our brothers and sisters in Christ do not have access to clean water and suffer from the lack of this basic necessity. We take it for granted that we have access to clean water. Donate to help build wells for water for those in need. Make an effort not to waste water. Remembering to turn off the water faucet when you are brushing your teeth or washing dishes can help, especially in regions suffering from drought.

Shelter the Homeless: There are many circumstances that could lead to someone becoming a person without a home. Christ encourages us to go out and meet those without homes, affirming their worth and helping them seek a resolution to the challenges they face. Donate time or money to organizations

that build homes for those who need shelter like Habitat for Humanity.

Visit the Sick: Those who are sick are often forgotten or avoided. I am so proud of our Parishioners who donate their time to visit the sick and bring them communion. This is a beautiful way to participate.

Visit the Prisoner: Talk to one of our Deacons to see if this ministry would be a good fit for you. No matter what someone has done, they deserve the opportunity to hear the Word of God and find the Truth of the message of Christ.

Bury the Dead: Funerals give us the opportunity to grieve and show others support during difficult times. Through our prayers and actions during these times we show our respect for life, which is always a gift from God, and comfort to those who mourn. Send a card to someone who has recently lost a loved one.

Give Alms to the Poor: Donate money to organizations that have the ability to provide support and services for those in need. Skip the morning latte and put that money in the collection basket at church. This Lent, give up eating out at restaurants. Pack your meals and donate the extra money to charities.

Remember, there are many Life Issues that are not listed in the Corporal Works of Mercy that we need to care about, too. Abortion, Euthanasia, and the Death Penalty are three. How we look at end of life care. How we support legislation that provides a "safety net" for those who do not have what they need. What are we doing to combat climate change and take care of the earth? I'm sure you can think of more. What is important is that we take action as well as pray.

DID YOU KNOW?

Learning from survivors' stories

Listening to the stories of victim-survivors is one way in which we can acknowledge what has happened to them and the impact the abuse has had in their lives; hearing these sacred stories can also help us to find patterns that empower stronger safeguarding measures, such as understanding how and where abusers gained access to their victims, how they groomed them, and what safeguards either failed or were not in place to properly protect a victim.
