Re-Enrolling An Existing Student

Existing families will see the Re-Enroll tab on the left sidebar in their Parent

Portal when they log in. From there, they can begin the process of re-enrolling their student. Below is what will appear when you first enter the EnrollMe section:

Because information for each child in your family may be slightly different (i.e. health information), you will need to complete the process for each child before completing the online portion of your 2023-2024 re-registration.



Once you have completed and submitted the online portion, please go to your Blackbaud tuition account to pay your registration fee (\$425 per child). PLEASE NOTE: If paying for a new student (sibling) for next year, be sure to pay for all students at one time AFTER you have added the new student(s) into the Gradelink system. If adding a new student(s) (sibling), you will need to adjust the amount accordingly (i.e. if you are paying for two students, you would adjust the payment to \$850). If you have questions regarding your payment, contact Denise Wold directly at DeniseW@stlouisedm.org or call her at 626-915-7873, ext. 211. Once your fee has been paid, and confirmed by our business office, your registration packet will be sent home with your oldest child.

Enrolling a Brand New Student With An Existing Student In the School


Existing families that have children already in the school can add other children not currently enrolled. Because you are enrolling a new student, you will need to create a temporary registration account for registering the new student as the information for the new student is not yet in Gradelink. This is the same process that prospective families go through when enrolling their children.



Keep in mind that the login credentials used to log into your Parent Portal will not work here.

- 1. Parents will log-in to their *Parent Portal* using their Gradelink login username and password.
- 2. They will then click the **Re-Enroll** tab on the left sidebar.
- 3. They will click the *Have a new student to enroll?* link at the top right of the page.
- 4. They will then follow the steps outlined in **Enrolling a New Student**.

Note: The new enrollment registration account is separate from Gradelink parent portal accounts for existing families. This is because not all prospective students enrolled to the school will be accepted into the school.



Once you have completed the new student's online registration, continue to your Blackbaud account ot pay the registration fees for all students.

2023-2024 Financial Aid Applications

The Financial Aid applications for the 2023-2024 school year for the Catholic Education Foundation financial aid grants and St. Louise de Marillac financial aid is now up on the school website!

In order to be considered for St. Louise financial aid, you must apply for CEF financial aid. In addition to the completed CEF application, St. Louise requires a complete set of your taxes and a detailed letter stating why you are requesting aid. All of this documentation must be submitted no later than Thursday, March 23, 2023.

Completed applications & documentation must be turned in to the Finance Office at the Parish Center. The School Office will not be accepting applications.

Applications that are not completely filled out and/or are missing necessary documentation will not be accepted. Please note that necessary documentation is different for each application.

PASTOR'S CORNER



Third Sunday of Lent

We have arrived at the third Sunday of Lent. Hopefully, we have been reflecting on prayer, fasting and almsgiving. At the end of this week, we'll be at the halfway mark!

Of the five Liturgical Seasons, Lent is the most somber. That is on purpose. Reconciliation is a significant part of this season. This is a good time to reflect on our lives. How are we relating to God? Our families. Our friends? Our co-workers? Most of us need a bit of a "tune-up" in our relationships.

Have you been taking for granted your spouse? Are you paying attention to your children? Do you make time for friends (as best you can in this very busy world!). As you reflect on those three relationships, now think about God. Is God a very im-

portant part of your life? Do you make time to get to know God better?

The first reading today is from Genesis. Moses has brought the Israelites into the desert to escape the slavery of the Egyptians. At this moment, they are not very happy with Moses or God. They are grumbling. They blame Moses for sending them into the desert where there is very little water. They are afraid. Moses (who has a very lively relationship with God) cries out, "What shall I do with this people? A little more and they will stone me!" God takes pity on Moses and the Israelites and tells Moses to take the staff he used to part the Red Sea and strike a particular rock. God promises he will be with him and where he strikes, water will pour out of the rock for the people.

God comes through. He has saved the Israelites from the Egyptians and they are not grateful. Moses has made personal sacrifices to lead them. But God is compassionate. God shows mercy. This is what we should be thinking about when we pray during Lent. Feel free to bring your complaints. Feel free to ask for help. Feel free to be grateful. A combination of all three would probably apply to most of us.

In the Gospel, Jesus breaks with tradition by asking a Samaritan woman for some

water. Samaritans are not people devout Jews would spend time with. But Jesus is interested in the woman. In talking to her, she confesses that she has had five husbands and the one she is with now is not her husband. He does not berate her. He describes what the living water and living bread will mean for all those who worship the Father. Jesus' disciples had been out getting provisions and were surprised to see him talking with a woman.

God comes through. In this case, he promises water and bread that will satisfy you forever. All he asks in return is that we worship God with "spirit and truth." This story is just as relevant today as it was two thousand years ago. God asks so little from us and promises so much. It is hard to worship God if we don't try to get to know him. To know someone takes effort. That is just as true with all of your relationships as it is with God.

When you are scratching your head and trying to figure out what to say to God that will be meaningful, I would suggest gratitude. Don't be like the Israelites who don't give God the credit God deserves. Just talk. Of course, there are all of the prayers you have been saying since you were a child. The Rosary is always a good prayer. Attend Stations of the Cross, at least once! Make sure you are attending weekly Mass. Be sure to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. All the priests in the area work together to make sure there are plenty of options of times to receive it that fit your schedule.

God is waiting to hear from you.

"Love is Never Love Until You Give it Away" In Solidarity with our Poor in the World: Eucharistic Healing Service

The Archdiocese provides fingerprinting services free of charge and works with the California Department of Justice to have these fingerprints submitted and scanned by the appropriate agencies. Anyone in the archdiocese who has regular contact with minors or vulnerable adults, whether in a paid or volunteer position, must be fingerprinted before they can begin work.
