



ONSITE COVID TESTING

We started our free COVID Testing on campus here at St. Louise last Friday. If you were in the program last year and want to continue for this year, you do need to re-register. I, if you are new to the program and wish to participate, you need to pre-register for testing. The website link is:

https://my.primary.health/l/stlouisedemarillacschool 2022

Testing takes place in the parish hall and take place every Friday at 8:00 am. This weekly testing is a free program through Heluna Health open to all on campus (vaccinated or unvaccinated), which includes staff, students, and any parents who volunteer on our campus.

You only need to register once and each time you test, it will take no longer than 15 minutes. Students signed up for the program will be taken over to the Hall during the morning by a staff member to get tested. If you are a parent volunteer and want to get tested, you just need to go directly to the hall at 8 am. Results are generated and provided to both those that have been tested and the school.

Please note this program is free for all participants. Testing is not required, but highly encouraged.

PASTOR'S CORNER



Politics and the Church

Most know that the Catholic Church cannot support a particular candidate or political party and keep their nonprofit status. Support means giving money or publishing pamphlets or signs in support of a candidate or a political party. However, Catholics are encouraged to vote using an informed conscience and understanding the teachings of the Catholic Church, especially teachings on social justice and the dignity of life. There is no doubt that Catholics were an enormous force for overturning Roe V. Wade.

Imagine what changes Catholics could bring about if we were as passionate about other issues. One thorny issue is the death penalty. The Catholic Church is opposed to the death penalty because it does not respect natural death. From womb to tomb, we like to say.

I think of legislation that we need to protect social programs for the most vulnerable Americans, especially children.

According to the USDA, more than 38 million people, including 12 million children, in the United States are food insecure. We should support programs like Food Stamps, WIC (a Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children) and SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). How many times did Jesus exhort us to the feed the hungry? Did he not give us the example when he fed the multitude with 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish? In addition, Catholics should be active in Charities that feed the vulnerable. We are good at our charitable work, especially here at St. Louise, but still need to fight for these government programs. They directly reinforce human dignity.

Access to medical care is not equitable in America. Services are not available in some areas and communities, and can be unaffordable, even with the Affordable Care Act. We should be lobbying our Congressmen and women to fix this problem.

Even the environment has a component that directly affects the dignity of the person. The earth is heating up. Not everyone can live in air conditioning, nor should they have to. Los Angeles County has a program to plant 90,000 trees. They are at 60,000 so far. Check with your local public works department to see if they are providing free trees. Is this a project you can get involved in?

Water resources have reached critical levels. There just isn't enough as a heating planet is evaporating our traditional sources. It is terrifying to see what is happening to the Colorado River or Lake Mead. As of July 13, 2022, Lake Mead was at 1,041 feet above sea level. If the lake were to fall below 895 feet it would no longer be able to produce electricity at the Hoover

Dam. Hopefully, each of us have taken seriously the LA County water restrictions. Homes with addresses ending in odd numbers are permitted to water their outdoor lawns and gardens on Mondays and Fridays, while those with even-numbered addresses are allowed to water on Thursdays and Sundays. Gardens that produce food can be hand watered as needed, and we need to pay attention to the trees on our properties that may need supplemental watering.

We Catholics have proven that we can make a difference in public policy. We have that right as citizens and that responsibility as Catholics. Jesus expected us to take the word out and spread it. The word is not just preaching, it is also action.

What makes a child run away?


An endangered runaway is a child under the age of 18 who goes missing on his or her own accord, and whose parents do not know where they are. These children are vulnerable to abuse, trafficking, homelessness, and substance abuse. A young person may think running away is the only option if he or she is subject to abuse at home, family conflicts, struggles with mental health, drugs, or alcohol, or becomes the victim of an online predator.
