

### PASTOR'S CORNER



### **Broken Lenten Promises**

Frequently, we do not make it all the way through Lent without breaking our Lenten sacrifice. This is not necessarily bad. It reminds us we are weak and need God's grace to be strong. It is a great opportunity to stand before the Lord with humility and honesty. This is a good way to renew your relationship with God. The hope during Lent is that you use this time to slow down and make that relationship stronger.

Holiness does not consist in never failing, but in rising immediately, recognizing our weakness and asking God's forgiveness. Our God is the God of mercy and forgiveness. In that we can depend. God's grace and mercy are what give us the strength to

get up and make a new beginning. Just because you failed in keeping your promise does not mean you give up. You try again and again if you have to.

Don't let Lent turn into a period where you hide from God, ashamed of your struggles with prayer, fasting or almsgiving. God comes to us, no matter what. Lent makes us friends—friends of God and one another. It helps to think about why we fast. A few Sunday's ago, we read the Gospel of Jesus going into the wilderness for 40 days. There he was tempted by the devil with several tests. Jesus refused everything he was tempted with. During the 40 days of Lent we acknowledge the sacrifice Jesus made during his ordeal. And part of this is giving up something for the 40 days: chocolate, Starbucks, ice cream, screen time, TV, etc. The list is endless. You give up something that you like and will miss as you fast. We are in solidarity with Jesus. While we miss whatever it is that we gave up we should remind ourselves why we did this in the first place and think of it as a gesture of love.

As I said before, if you break your Lenten promise try, try again. Reconciliation is a prominent theme during Lent. So, you start by confessing your weaknesses to God. You are asked to receive the sacrament of Reconciliation. Breaking your Lenten promise is not

a sin. You do not have to go to confession because you ate a piece of chocolate! Your sacrifice is something between you and God.

However, you do have to go to confession during the Lenten season which is why priests go to each other's churches to make sure there are enough priests to hear confession. Each Church will publish the hours of Reconciliation, not just in your church but at the surrounding parishes to give you the maximum opportunities to find a service that works with your schedule. Since you have been working on your relationship with God during this time, it will feel good to have a fresh start.

I hope Lent has been spiritually rewarding for you. This is a special season in the Church's calendar. If you have been participating in the "pillars" of Lent, almsgiving, prayer and fasting, your experience of Easter will be deeper.


