



PASTOR'S CORNER



Who are our Heroes?

When Jesus entered Jerusalem for the last time, his reputation preceded him. Many had heard of his deeds. The lame walked, the blind could see and even the dead were raised and lived. If you or I heard that someone was doing this today, we might be skeptical, but we'd probably want to see him if he came to Covina. This was the mood when Jesus came to Jerusalem. A great crowd had come to see him. He was hailed as he rode into the city. He was treated as though he were a conquering leader. However, what followed after tells us that this

hero worship was not on solid ground.

How do we choose heroes today? Many of our heroes are athletes, musicians, or actors. Many of us see our parents or spouses as heroes. Regular citizens who perform heroic acts become heroes, at least for a short while. So, what exactly is a hero and why do we admire them?

Traditionally, heroes were people who were extraordinarily strong. They performed superhuman deeds. Greek myths were full of those characters. I guess our modern-day athletes could be characterized that way. Olympic athletes train their bodies to perform all sorts of amazing things. We admire people with true talent; talent they have nurtured and sharpened through practice. It makes sense that we should admire these people, but should they be considered heroes?

These very human talented men and women constantly disappoint us. An athlete is discovered to have used steroids. Actors and musicians have used illegal drugs. Some have abused wives and girlfriends. Some have outsized egos that make them actually believe they are better than everyone else and rules should not apply to them. We are disappointed because we ascribed heroism to them. I have heard people say about some such celebrity "Oh, he or she is such a good person." We don't know if that is true or not. I'm sure they, like all of us, do kind and generous acts. At least, we are supposed to.

I hope we can look at heroism through the lens of holiness, starting with Jesus. Jesus was a polarizing figure. During his lifetime, his followers witnessed him perform miracles and believed in the new morality that he preached: a message of love, gentleness, generosity, and forgiveness. These values conflicted with Roman values of power and strength.



Jesus is a true hero. When he was needed by God, he stepped up voluntarily and acted as an instrument of salvation for humanity. He sacrificed his life for others. Jesus was, and is, a transforming leader, inspiring people and elevating them to new levels of morality. Historian and author H. G. Wells wrote, "I am an historian, I am not a believer, but I must confess as a historian that this penniless preacher from Nazareth is irrevocably the very center of history. Jesus Christ is easily the most dominant figure in all history."

We know Jesus carried power within himself. He was Divine. But he never used that power to benefit himself. When the devil tempted him in the desert, Jesus did not once fall for self-preservation. He pointed out he didn't need any of that. He knew his Father was with him. If he had wanted, he could have avoided crucifixion. We know he was tempted by the thought. In the Garden of Gethsemane, he asked the Father that if it were possible that this tragedy not befall him, make it so, though only if it was the Father's will. As we know, Jesus went on to finish the mission he was sent for. This is holiness, allowing yourself to be the purpose for which you were made. Holiness is pretty heroic.
