

PASTOR'S CORNER



St. Joseph the Worker

Today is the Feast day of Saint Joseph the Worker. This special feast day is added to the other feast days when we celebrate St. Joseph, husband of Mary, the mother of God, and earthly father of Jesus. In 1955, Pope Pius the XII added the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker. Joseph, who was given the noble task of caring and watching over the Virgin Mary and Jesus, now cares for and watches over the Church and models for all the dignity of human work.

For Catholics, May 1st, celebrates the relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion. The dignity of work is a key component of Catholic social justice teaching. Pope Francis

has made the point that caring for the earth is an aspect of the labors God demands of his children. Saint Joseph, the carpenter, and foster father of Jesus is but one example of the holiness of human labor.

Jesus, too, was a carpenter. He learned the trade from Saint Joseph and spent his early adult years working in Joseph's carpentry shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as preacher and healer. In his encyclical *Laborem Exercens*, Pope John Paul II stated: "the Church considers it her task always to call attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help to guide [social] changes so as to ensure authentic progress by man and society."

Saint Joseph is held up as a model of such work. Pius XII emphasized this when he said, "The spirit flows to you and to all men from the heart of the God-man, Savior of the world, but certainly, no worker was ever more completely and profoundly penetrated by it than the foster father of Jesus, who lived with Him in closest intimacy and community of family life and work."

In our country, May Day was celebrated by organizers of the Labor movement in the mid 1800's. It was an attempt to end many of the inhumane conditions found in the new factories set up during the Industrial Revolution. Socialist and Communist leaders worldwide embraced May day as a day to protest the excesses of Capitalism.



The Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker was a response to the "May Day" celebrations for workers sponsored by Communists throughout the world. In the United States, a national holiday was established in 1894 as Labor Day on the first Monday in September.

A day for labor has been set aside in 66 countries. In many of these countries, May 1st is still the day recognized as labor day. Other countries have moved the day to other months. Canada, like us, chose a day in September. Mexico still celebrates the day on May 1st. When we celebrate St. Joseph the Worker, we see work as dignified and the necessity to protect workers from unfair and unsafe labor practices.
