

#### PASTOR'S CORNER



#### Why we Need Immigrants

When someone says the word immigration, strong feelings erupt on both sides of our polarized nation. I am asking everyone to put that aside because I want to talk about how we as Christians should be thinking about this issue.

I want to say right up front, that any country has the right to set their immigration policy. So, the question is, how do we work within that "given?" I am going to talk about the economic impact of our large (undocumented) population, and then I want to talk about what we might want to propose as solutions to solving the myriad of problems facing us as an enormous migrant

population gathers at our Southern border.

There are some misconceptions about the economic effect of having a large undocumented group of people who live in the US. The first is these immigrants are taking away jobs from native born Americans. These immigrants are estimated to be about 11 million. That's a big number. So, what are these people doing? They are filling the lowest paid and least skilled jobs, usually in the service industry. Very few native-born Americans are lining up for these jobs. We keep hearing that employers are having trouble filling needed jobs. Even when here undocumented, these workers pay into Social Security that they will never be able to collect.

Another complaint is that we pay too much by giving help to immigrants, like food stamps or Medi Cal. Most immigrants who



receive benefits like SNAP or Medicaid are employed or are married to someone who works — a sign that they are working in low-paid jobs. The native-born children of these immigrants usually are educated and make better wages than their parents. It is not uncommon that those children help their parents out financially.

Finally, the native-born population is aging. This is the result of the large post World War II population retiring and the trend of a lower birth rate. Immigrants help lower our average age. These workers are contributing to the pool of Social Security dollars needed to keep this growing retiring population receiving their benefits.

These are some compelling reasons to keeping the immigrants already in the United States regardless of legal status.

The second issue is what to do about the increasing migration worldwide of people from war, violence, and poverty. We know Jesus expects us to care for the most vulnerable. And yet, how do countries admit everyone who needs shelter. We know that there Is inequity in resources between rich countries (like ours) and poor countries. What can we do to close that gap? How can we help lift up those who are in desperate straits?

We need to rethink our foreign policy. Can we be more generous without harming Americans? Personally, I think so. Can we work together with our European partners to create a common solution that we develop together? Can we admit more of the most vulnerable immigrants trying to get access to our country by re-thinking how many people we admit each year? A great number of these refugees are children. We absolutely need to figure out how we help children. They are the most important resource in our world. I think we can do this. It will need creative thinking. It will need Americans who look at the issue with their hearts rather than their pocketbooks. All I ask is that we start thinking about the policies we as Americans can develop to help others. We can do this, together.

#### **EASTER MISSION**

St. Louise is hosting an Easter Mission through Wednesday, May 10th at 7 PM in the Church.

The Mission's theme is on the Eucharist and it will provide a means for parishioners to grow in their understanding of the Eucharist and ways the Eucharist invites them to deeper discipleship. The three day Mission will be lead by Fr. Frank DeSiano, CSP.

Fr. Frank DeSiano, born in New York City, was ordained as a Paulist priest in 1972. He has served as pastor in downtown New York and in Chicago. In 1990, he earned a D. Min. from Boston University, completing his dissertation on "Parish Based Evangelization." He served as consultor for the US Bishops' Committee on Evangelization for over a dozen years.

He has written numerous books on spirituality, discipleship and evangelization, and is frequently published in periodicals like The Priest, Catechetical Leader, and Deacon Digest. In 1994, he was elected President of the Paulist Fathers.

He presently lives in Washington DC where he is president of Paulist Evangelization Ministries. He travels widely, conducting parish renewals (missions), presenting to Catholic clergy at convocations and retreats, and discussing the relationship of evangelization and catechesis.

His latest book will be published by Paulist Press: "Discipleship for the Future: Spirituality of the Kingdom."

He recently published: "Catholic Discipleship: Spiritual Exercises and Reflections," and "Beyond the Pews: from Parishioners to Disciples," both at www.pemdc.org.

He has been working on several pastoral tools: Pathways in Faith (RCIA and Adult Faith Formation), and The Catholic Discipleship Profile<sup>™</sup>.

He currently also serves on the Editorial Board of the International Journal for Catechesis and Evangelization.
