

#### **Some Thoughts on Pope Francis**

Since the very first Pope was elected by the College of Cardinals, controversy swirled around the election. It was true for Pope Benedict XVI as well as Pope Francis. This should not be surprising. The people elected are just men and they have virtues and failings. Different people look at the world from different perspectives.

So, I want to share some thoughts on Pope Francis. Right from moments after his election, we knew Pope Francis would rule differently from past Popes. It is traditional that the new Pope gives a blessing for the people of the world, but Francis started out by saying, "Now, I would like to give you a blessing, but first I want to ask you for a favor. Before the bishop blesses the people, I ask that you pray to the Lord so that he blesses me."

I think the differences of opinion about how Francis is living out his time as Pope can be summarized pretty simply: Those who like Pope Francis are energized by his apparent wish to move the Church forward in some non-traditional ways. Those who are critical of Pope Francis want a bigger emphasis on the traditions of the Church. Looking at the ways in which Pope Francis rules as head of the Church and how Pope Benedict ruled can give us some clues as to the differences.

Like most popes, they each have different strengths. I think Benedict was the better academic theologian, and Francis the better pastoral theologian. Benedict was the better formal writer, Francis the better public speaker.

Benedict is an introvert, Francis an extrovert. Benedict was better at reaching out to the "lost sheep" of the Traditionalist world, Francis is better at reaching out to the "lost sheep" of the overlooked and oft-ignored parts of the world.

Francis is better at acting on areas that need reform and attention within the church (like clericalism, and structural reforms). Benedict was better at making significant changes and new structures (like introducing the Anglican ordinariates, or changing canon law regarding marriage.) Francis is better at dialogue and listening, and doing so openly, Benedict was better at reigning in dissenting voices among the cardinals and bishops.

One of the more controversial acts of the Pope was the recent decision to restrict the celebration of the Tridentine Latin Mass and liturgy. Pope Francis said, "I hope that we can return to the true intentions of Benedict XVI and John Paul II," who hoped to maintain church unity and heal schisms by approving celebrations of the pre-Vatican II Mass.

Francis dislikes clericalism. He is constantly telling bishops and priests not to act like princes but rather like servants to the people of God. For Francis, the church is not a country club for the good and beautiful. Rather, it is a "poor church for the poor," a "field hospital" for the wounded. That is why he stresses compassion and mercy.

Never forget though that both men are holy, intelligent, and caring men who love the Church, and who yearn to serve Jesus.

#### **Residence Restriction Laws**

Residence restriction laws are state and local laws that prevent convicted sexual offenders from living within a specific range of a school, park, daycare, bus stop, or other known area for children. Many states have adopted some form of residence restriction to prevent sexual offenders from committing repeat crimes. These laws exist and have an impact, but they are only one layer of protection and are not a guarantee that a park, bus stop, or other space is safe.
