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

LATE RE-REGISTRATION

For those who missed the "Paperwork & Service Hours Sign-Up" Night last Thursday, please turn it in to Ms. Sue ASAP in the school office during office hours. If you have not received your paperwork yet, PLEASE contact Ms. Sue ASAP.

The late re-registration fee is now \$475.00 per child; and, can be paid through your Blackbaud tuition account.



If your child has any prescription medication in the Health Room, please pick it up by TODAY, MARCH 31ST.

Medication will not be released to the student. It *must* be picked up by the parent.

If the medication is not picked up by the last day of school, they will be thrown out over the summer.



2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR START DATE

The 2022-2023 School Year will begin for Grades TK through Grade 8 on Monday, Aug. 15th. Dismissal will be at 12 noon on the following days that week:

Wed., 8-17-22

The regular full day sessions for Grades 1-8 will start on Thursday, 8-18-22. Regular dismissal for these classes will be Mondays thru Thursdays at 2:45 pm and Fridays at 2:00 pm.

TK & Kindergarten will have NOON dismissal on Thurs., 8-18-22 and Fri., 8-19-22. They will begin their regular daily 2:00 pm dismissal on Mon., 8-22-22.

Daycare will be available beginning the first day of school, Aug. 15th.



Please note that there will be **NO DAYCARE** provided after school on the last day of school—**TOMORROW**, **JUNE 1ST**. Please be sure that someone is scheduled to pick your child(ren) immediately following the Father's Day/Last Day School Mass.

PASTOR'S CORNER



Sacrifice of Soldiers and Civilians During War

Tomorrow we celebrate Memorial Day. We remember all who have died in military service. I ask that we remember all who have died because of war. And I make an even greater plea, that we remember all service men and women throughout the world, foes or friends.

This day originally was called Decoration Day. It began after the civil war when people would go out to the graves of fallen soldiers and decorate them. Later it was named Memorial Day and falls on the last Monday in May. It is a patriotic holiday like the 4th of July and Veterans Day.

Serving your country through military service has varied over the years. The minutemen of our Revolutionary war gave voluntary service. The people rose up to protest the unfair treatment they received at the hand of the English. This was a war of freedom, throwing off colonialism.

About 2.75 million soldiers fought in the Civil War—2 million for the North and 750,000 for the South. At first, most soldiers were voluntary, augmenting the standing army of the time. But as the war dragged on, both sides used conscription, the mandatory drafting of its eligible men. Most, if not all were fighting for patriotic reasons.

In the modern era, conscription was used for all wars until 1972. Eligible men had to sign up to serve. In 1940, Congress enacted the Selective Training and Service Act. All males between the ages of 21 and 35 were ordered to register for the draft and the first national lottery was held. This was in place until 1972 near the end of US participation in the Vietnam war. From 1972 to today, military service is voluntary.

Today we look at Ukraine and see how bravely the people are fighting for their country. Using powers conferred by martial law, the government has banned all men aged 18-60 from leaving the country. Instead, they must report for duty at a military recruitment office.

Whether voluntary or drafted, men and women who serve their country are brave. These who died in service are whom we commemorate. And I suggest all who have died because of war worldwide need to be remembered and prayed for. There is a song I like that meets this desire called *My Song*.

This is my song, O God of all the nations,
A song of peace for lands afar and mine.
This is my home, the country where my heart is.
Here are my hopes, my dreams, my holy shrine.
But other hearts in other lands are beating
With hopes and dreams as true and high as mine.
Oh, hear my song, O God of all the nations,
A song of peace for their land and for mine.



My final words to you are for you and your family talk about the wishes of the patient; come back to this topic as time goes by because people sometimes change their minds; and try to cherish each moment you share during those remaining days. Life can be hard, but so can death. We meet these challenges through prayer and trust in God.



Helmets save lives
