

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#### PASTOR'S CORNER



#### **Corpus Christi and Eucharistic Adoration**

Next Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Of course, in one way, every Sunday we celebrate Corpus Christ when we receive the body and blood of Christ at the Eucharistic table. In the Gospel of John, we are promised, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."


Pope St. John Paul II, in his encyclical on the Eucharist, writes: "When the Church celebrates the Eucharist, the memorial of her Lord's death and resurrection, this central event of salvation becomes really present and "the work of our redemption is carried out". This sacrifice is so decisive

for the salvation of the human race that Jesus Christ offered it and returned to the Father only after he had left us a means of sharing in it as if we had been present there —"He had left us a means of sharing in it [his death and resurrection] as if we had been present there, with Mary, Mary Magdalene, St. Peter, St. John, etc. We are part of the history of the sacrifice of Christ. That should give us pause; this is a big deal.

The US Catholic Bishops have called for a three-year eucharistic revival that began last year on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The goal is to see this as a time of healing for the entire church as well as a reawakening of understanding of the sacrament of the Eucharist for Catholics across the country.

In 2023, the emphasis will be on parishes increasing Catholics' understanding of what the Eucharist really means. Part of the impetus prompting this effort was a Pew study in the fall of 2019 that showed just 30% of Catholics understand the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Eucharistic adoration is now an integral part of ministry to young Catholics. It has become a staple of youth retreats and campus



Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York has participated in Catholic Underground services, in which every month thousands of worshippers, mostly young people, flock to Our Lady of Good Counsel Church on Manhattan's Upper East Side. There, in front of the exposed Eucharist, there is a steady rhythm of guitar music mixed with sometimes impassioned readings and preaching from members of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal, which organizes the gathering. Young people who participate in eucharistic adoration are part of "a new minority who gives their bishop so much hope," said Cardinal Dolan.

Pope Francis heartily agrees! It is good to "waste time adoring" Christ present in the Holy Eucharist, Pope Francis said. "It is good to adore in silence before the Most Blessed Sacrament, to be in the consoling presence of Jesus and there to draw the apostolic impetus to be instruments of goodness, tenderness and welcome in the community, the Church, and the world." Francis said the world today has lost the sense of what it means to engage in the form of prayer known as adoration or worship; "to waste time adoring."

As part of this renewal, we need to look at how we can make Eucharistic adoration a part of our own prayer practices.
