

We have had several incidents of parents circumventing some of these safety procedures and we are worried there will be an injury to someone!



ELEMENTARY SCHOOL NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY 2022-2023 (updated)

SCHOOL STUDENT NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

The school, mindful of its mission to be a witness to the love of Christ for all, admits students regardless of race, color, national origin, and/or ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school.

The school does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, disability, medical condition, sex, or national and/or ethnic origin in the administration of educational policies and practices, scholarship programs, and athletic and other school-administered programs, although certain athletic leagues and other programs may limit participation and some archdiocesan schools operate as single-sex schools.

While the school does not discriminate against students with special needs, a full range of services may not always be available to them. Decisions concerning the admission and continued enrollment of a student in the school are based upon the student's emotional, academic, and physical abilities and the resources available to the school in meeting the student's needs.

[Note that this School Student Non-Discrimination Policy does not provide nor imply that the archdiocese waives any legal exceptions or exemptions that may apply to it as a religious nonprofit organization.]

This Catholic Elementary School publishes the above policy in the staff and parent/student handbooks, public relations/recruitment brochures and in other publications such as the parish bulletin and school newspaper. The school also publishes applicable grievance procedures in the staff and parent/student handbooks.

POLÍTICA DE NO DISCRIMINACIÓN ESCOLAR

La escuela, consciente de su misión de ser un testimonio del amor de Cristo por todos, admite estudiantes sin importar su raza, color, origen nacional y/u origen étnico a todos los derechos, privilegios, programas y actividades generalmente otorgados o disponibles a los alumnos de la escuela.

PASTOR'S CORNER



Brothers All (Fratelli Tutti)

Today, I want to talk to you about Pope Francis' latest Encyclical, entitled *Fratelli Tutti* which translates to All Brothers. He based this work on an admonition of St. Francis of Assisi to his Franciscan brothers and sisters to follow a way of life marked by the Gospel. Pope Francis, like St. Francis, wants us to love one another and follow the Gospel way.

In particular, he wants us to love one another, even if the other is far away. He starts the document by lamenting the ills of the world. He quickly moves on to talk about "a stranger on the road." (Chapter Two) In the parable of the Good Samaritan, he points out that Jesus was telling us to extend our love and care for friends and family, to those who are strangers to us. Each new day should be seen as an opportunity to "include, integrate, and lift up the fallen" rather than "an arena for [our] own power plays." (Par 77)

Pope Francis goes on to say that the social, loving dimension of human life is universal, natural, and essential. By its nature, love calls for growth in openness. The Encyclical states that the spiritual stature of a person's life is measured by love, which always "takes first place" and leads us to seek better for the life of the other, far from all selfishness. (Par 92-93) The right to live with dignity cannot be denied to anyone, the Pope affirms, and since rights have no borders, no one can remain excluded, regardless of where they are born.

The fourth chapter deals with migration and immigration. With their lives "at stake" (Par 37), fleeing from war, persecution, natural catastrophes, exploitative trafficking, migrants ripped from their communities of origin, are to be welcomed, protected, supported, and integrated. We need to respect the right of migrants to seek a better life elsewhere. In receiving countries, the right balance will be between the protection of citizens' rights and the guarantee of welcome and assistance for migrants. (Par 38-40)



In the sixth and seventh chapters, Pope Francis takes us to dialogue and encounter. Peace is connected to truth, justice, and mercy. Far from the desire for vengeance, it is "proactive" and aims at forming a society based on service to others and on the pursuit of reconciliation and mutual development. (Par 227-229) He described the work of peace as on-going. He called this the hard but joyful work of encountering others who are different from ourselves. For this we can call on the Holy Spirit for the gift of kindness.

In the eighth and final chapter, the Pope focuses on "Religions at the service of fraternity in our world" and emphasizes that terrorism is not due to religion but to erroneous interpretations of religious texts, as well as "policies linked to hunger, poverty, injustice, oppression." (Par 282-283) A journey of peace among religions is both possible and necessary to guarantee religious freedom, a fundamental human right for all believers. (see Par 279).

I urge you to read Pope Francis' Encyclicals. You can get the complete texts for free on the Vatican website. This one was his sixth. *Evangelii Gaudium, Apostolic Exhortation On The Joy Of The Gospel* is a good one to read along with *Laudato Si, Apostolic Exhortation On Care For Our Common Home*. Much wisdom is expressed in the Pope's Encyclicals, and he shows us a pathway to follow the Gospels!
