



PASTOR'S CORNER



The Meaning of Eucharistic Adoration – Personal Stories

From Lisbon, Portugal, Pope Francis on August 2nd of this year, reflected on the urgency of taking up again "the prayer of adoration" before the tabernacle to recover "the taste and passion for evangelization." "I would like to ask a question here, but each one should answer it interiorly. How do I pray? Only in adoration, only before the Lord can the taste and passion for evangelization be recovered," the pontiff said.

After noting that "a lot of prayer is needed," he pointed out that much of the Church has abandoned silent prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

And this may be the problem in our modern world. The idea of silence, stillness is foreign. All prayers are good, but most of us pray with a lot of words. We rarely still our hearts and empty our minds. We need to just listen for God's word, God's call. Eucharistic adoration requires silence. I am sharing stories from two people on their experiences of eucharistic adoration:

"Holy Thursday may be my favorite holy day of the year. We immerse ourselves in the story of Jesus. Jesus sharing food with friends, Jesus being betrayed by one of them, Jesus pleading with God, Jesus accepting the will of God. We pray with Jesus in the Garden. We mourn what we know is about to happen. This is all played out in front of the tabernacle, the house of the Lord. At the end of mass, when the tabernacle is emptied of all consecrated hosts and the door of the tabernacle is left open, I feel such a loss. It is like there is a hole in my heart. In my parish, we process from the church to the place where the Eucharist is exposed, and we can spend time in adoration. There is a shared sorrow. But, as you sit there quietly, you begin to feel that you have not been abandoned. Jesus is truly present. Parishioners come and go to be in the presence of Christ. I find that emptying my mind of thought allows my heart to fill with the Holy Spirit. This is always my most profound experience of Eucharistic adoration."

"For as long as I can remember, I have had a practice of Eucharistic adoration. In my home country of Nigeria, everyone I know participates in Eucharistic adoration. I find peace when I sit in front of the tabernacle. When I leave the Church, I feel renewed, refreshed. Eucharistic adoration is particularly important to me when I have a problem I need to solve or need advice on which way to go with a decision, or just vexed with something that has happened. I find that in front of the tabernacle, I can just lose myself to everything and if I sit long enough a solution just pops into my head. Sometimes this may take several trips, especially if what I need is big. Eucharistic adoration increases my faith so I can share that with others."

I hope many of you will come to sit silently in front of the tabernacle or participate in adoration before the exposed host. I promise you; you will feel better for doing it.
