CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR STUDENTS OF THE WEEK!





ONSITE COVID TESTING IS HERE!

We are happy to announce that we will finally begin offering COVID-19 testing on site. This process took a bit longer than expected to begin, but testing will begin this Friday, October 15, 2021.

Testing will be held in the parish hall from 8:00 am to 11:00 am. This testing is a free program through Heluna and Primary Health. It is open to all on campus (vaccinated or unvaccinated), including staff, students and any parents who volunteer on our campus. This program will also satisfy the testing requirements for those who are in our athletic programs.

If you choose to participate in the program, you will need to pre-register for testing by copyng this this link into your browser and following the directions to sign up:

You only need to register once and each time you test, it will take no longer than 15 minutes. Results are generated and provided to both those that have been tested and the school.

Please note this program is free for all participants. Testing is not required, but highly encouraged.



PLEASE NOTE: You MUST REGISTER AND PAY through your SMART Tuition account to reserve your spot.

Log into your SMART Tuition account - parent.smarttuition.com (if you need help logging into your SMART Tuition account, please contact SMART at 1-800-468-8996)

- Select "purchase optional items" at the top of the screen
- "Select student(s)" in the middle of the screen
- Check the name of all students you wish to order for and select "go"
- Check all of the items you wish to order for each student
- Choose the quantity you wish to order for each student (please note your total amount below)
- Select "save"
- Consent to the agreement (this is a description of the shopping cart items you have purchased)
- Check "I have read the description of this item and agree to purchase" (you will have to do this for each item)
- Check "I understand that all purchases are final and non-refundable" (you will have to do this for each item)
- Select "agree"
- Select "continue"
- Click "pay now" (all shopping cart items are pay now items they cannot be added to your SMART invoice)



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PASTOR'S CORNER



War, Child Soldiers, and a Stolen Childhood

A friend of mine once mentioned that he thought the United States suffered from PMS, an obsession with power, money, and sex. Certainly, popular culture promotes casual sex. Everywhere you look you see ads using sexuality to sell a product. Television and movies use sex to capture people's attention. This is in direct contradiction with the teachings of the Catholic Church.

The problem we run into is that the societal message on sex is all about gratification. In our teachings, sex is reserved for marriage as an expression of married love. In 1968, Pope Paul VI wrote the

encyclical "Humanae Vitae" (Human Life). The Pope begins with the statement that "the transmission of human life is a most serious role in which married people collaborate freely and responsibly with God the Creator." He claims that this is a source of great joy to them, although it means many difficulties and hardships.

In 2008, upon the 40th anniversary of Humanae Vitae Pope Benedict wanted to set the record straight on this encyclical. He said the encyclical was very poorly understood. He called the topic, "so controversial, yet so crucial for humanity's future." The Church continues to reflect "in an ever new and deeper way on the fundamental principles that concern marriage and procreation". The key message of Humanae vitae is love. Benedict states, "that the fullness of a person is achieved by a unity of soul and body, but neither spirit nor body alone can love, only the two together. If this unity is broken, if only the body is satisfied, love becomes a commodity. Ultimately, Benedict says, Christian love grows out of the love of Christ.

But again, why chastity? Where is the love in confining sex to marriage? When we contemplate chastity, we tend to think of it in a negative light. Here we need to go back to the Catholic concept of the dignity of the human person. We are to treat others as persons, for their own sake, not as objects of passion.

During the period of dating and then engagement for marriage, the two people in love are learning about one another. Chastity gives the couple time see each other with some clarity, both in terms of strengths and weaknesses. Respective strengths are not overglamorized. You can objectively discern whether you think you could live with the other's weaknesses, and simultaneously work on your own faults in light of the other's observations. Sex alone can color how people see one another. Sex becomes the goal, not discovery of the whole person.



Chastity is an unpopular concept in the society we live in today. So, we Catholics are called to be counter cultural. We reserve sex to marriage. We promote the Sacrament of Marriage in recognition that sex is a gift from God, one that helps strengthen marriage and brings children into this world. The love of the two is cemented in the sexual act and that love mirrors the love of God for us.

Any person who practices chastity will develop self-control over his or her emotions and body. That self-control will be valuable throughout a person's life.


The prayer vigil begins September 22 and ends on October 31. We are asking for all parishioners to offer prayer and fasting for an end to abortion for these 40 days.
