



PASTOR'S CORNER



Annulments

Every few years, I like to make a pitch to our parishioners who have been previously married in the church to see if they are eligible for an annulment. For those who have been married only civilly and that marriage ended in divorce, there is a similar process to dissolve that marriage. The reason I want to remind you about the annulment process is to encourage you to have your current marriage celebrated as a sacrament in the Catholic Church. I realize many of our parishioners are divorced and remarried. An annulment allows the parties to have their initial marriage declared null and invalid. Therefore, the couple can now receive the sacrament of marriage. For those

Catholics who were never married in the church and there have been no divorces we call their sacramental marriage service a con validation. It does not require an annulment.

Having witnessed many couples who have gone through the annulment process, I can say with some certainty that ad-

dressing the problems in a previous marriage can bring real healing from the hurt of a divorce. There is grief to be acknowledged after a marriage fails and the annulment process can help the person who did get a divorce process that.

There are many myths about annulment, and I want to address some of these:

Myth 1) A PERSON WHO RECEIVES A DIVORCE IS EXCOMMUNICATED FROM THE CATHOLIC CHURCH. This is not true. A divorce is a civil procedure and the church respects civil law.

Myth 2) AN ANNULMENT COSTS THOUSANDS OF DOLLARS. This is not

true. The Church has done everything it can do to make annulments affordable. The archdiocese spends a lot of money to determine the validity of a previous marriage, but the applicants pay a fraction of that cost.

Myth 3) ONLY CATHOLIC MARRIAGES NEED TO BE ANNULLED. Not true. Every marriage is considered a promise for life, a promise until death. It makes no difference whether that promise was made in a Catholic ceremony or not. No one, no matter what their religious affiliation or membership is required to get all previous marriages annulled.

Myth 4) AN ANNULMENT MEANS THE MARRIAGE NEVER TOOK PLACE. Not true. An annulment can't erase history and doesn't try to. An annulment in the Catholic Church deals only with the sacrament of marriage, and not the legal, historical, emotional truth of marriage. An annulment states that the sacrament was never present in the marriage, and not that the marriage never took place.

What the church is looking for when investigating an application for annulment is to determine whether the marriage was flawed at the time the couple entered into the marriage. It is not a "Catholic Divorce." Something had to be present at the time the marriage ceremony took place, that kept one partner of the marriage to be incompetent to enter into the marriage covenant. A simple example would be one person was an alcoholic or a drug addict at the time of marriage and was not competent to enter into the covenant of marriage. Another could be if there was no intent to remain married for life or that one or both parties had no intention of being faithful.

This is why I encourage our divorced and remarried couples to come to the office to set up an appointment to see if you are eligible for an annulment. Nothing would be more beautiful than seeing you celebrate your sacramental church wedding.
